## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8427

- 1 WHEREAS, Washington State needs to insure excellence in education
- 2 and training for its citizens working in high-technology industries;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, The education and capability of its work force is the
- 5 single most important factor in economic competitiveness; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The state needs to provide a climate where new and
- 7 emerging high-technology industries can develop; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Washington State needs to continually expand its economic
- 9 base by insuring business investment and expansion; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There is a need to support industry with science,
- 11 engineering, and technology related programs that produce graduates and
- 12 enable Washington-based high-technology firms to recruit locally and
- 13 provide opportunities to Washington citizens that will improve the
- 14 quality of life in the state; and
- WHEREAS, There is a need to represent key institutions and agencies
- 16 in the planning and development of high-technology industries, and to

- 1 cooperate in decisions that promote and provide for growth in high-
- 2 technology industries; and
- 3 WHEREAS, There is a need to affect and educate the policymakers of
- 4 the state to maintain and improve the educational opportunities that
- 5 support high-technology investment;
- 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
- 7 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That a preliminary
- 8 study be completed and submitted to the Legislature no later than
- 9 December 15, 1992; and
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the study shall identify the main
- 11 issues related to becoming a leader in high-technology education.
- 12 Efforts are needed by business, state and local government, and
- 13 educational institutions to respond to high-technology needs. The
- 14 study will make recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature on
- 15 the steps needed to insure Washington State will become a leader in
- 16 high-technology in the future; and
- 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Governor shall appoint a High-
- 18 Technology Study Committee for the purpose of this resolution.
- 19 Representation on the Committee shall insure an adequate number of
- 20 members from both Eastern and Western Washington. Representatives
- 21 shall include two members from each caucus in the House of
- 22 Representatives and the Senate, one member from the Department of Trade
- 23 and Economic Development, one member from the Higher Education
- 24 Coordinating Board, three executive officers of high-technology
- 25 corporations, and three other members chosen among the citizens at
- 26 large representing business, labor, government, or educational
- 27 institutions; and
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Committee shall be authorized to
- 29 hold meetings, solicit funds, and conduct studies as needed to meet the
- 30 objectives of the resolution. No state funds are appropriated for this

1 purpose.
