38 39 ((The salaries of)) Compensation for the mayor and the ((councilmen)) councilmembers shall be fixed by ordinance and may be revised from time to time by ordinance((, but any increase in the compensation attaching to an office shall not be applicable to the term then being served by the incumbent if such incumbent is a member of the city legislative body fixing his own compensation or as mayor in a mayor council code city casts a tie breaking vote relating to such ordinance: PROVIDED, That)). Compensation for the mayor may be increased during the mayor's current term of office if the mayor of such a city does not cast ((such)) a tie-breaking vote((, his salary may be increased during his term of office)) to adopt the ordinance revising the compensation for the mayor.

Until the first elective officers of a newly organized code city under this mayor-council plan of government may lawfully be paid the compensation provided by ((such salary)) an ordinance establishing different levels of compensation, such officers shall be entitled to be compensated in the same manner and in the same amount as the compensation paid to officers of such city performing comparable services immediately prior to adoption of this mayor-council plan.

Until ((a salary ordinance can be passed and become effective as to)) elective officers of a newly incorporated code city may lawfully be paid the compensation provided by an ordinance establishing different levels of compensation, such first elective officers shall be entitled to compensation as follows: (1) In cities having less than five thousand inhabitants, the mayor shall be entitled to a salary of fifty dollars per calendar hundred ((and)) month one ((councilman)) councilmember shall be entitled to twenty dollars per meeting for not more than two meetings per month; (2) in cities having more than five thousand but less than fifteen thousand inhabitants, the mayor shall be entitled to a salary of three hundred ((and)) fifty dollars per calendar month and a ((councilman)) councilmember shall be entitled to one hundred ((and)) fifty dollars per calendar month; and (3) in cities having more than fifteen thousand inhabitants, the mayor shall be entitled to a salary of twelve hundred ((and)) fifty dollars per calendar month and a ((councilman)) councilmember shall be entitled to four hundred dollars per calendar month((: PROVIDED, That such interim compensation shall remain in effect only until a salary
