

1 **SSB 5056 - H COMM AMD NOT ADOPTED 4-13-93**

2 By Committee on Fisheries & Wildlife

3 On page 2, beginning on line 1, strike sections 3 and 4 and  
4 insert:

5 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The maximum daily wet weight harvest  
6 or possession of seaweed for personal use from all private and  
7 public tidelands and state bedlands is ten pounds per person.  
8 The department of natural resources in cooperation with the  
9 department of fisheries may establish seaweed harvest limits of  
10 less than ten pounds for conservation purposes.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** By December 31, 1993, the department of  
12 natural resources in cooperation with the department of fisheries  
13 shall develop and report to the appropriate committees of the  
14 legislature on a process and budget necessary to accomplish the  
15 following:

16 1) Inventory and monitor the seaweed resource for seaweed  
17 species that are or have the potential to be harvested for  
18 recreational purposes;

19 2) Develop a management plan that will address the appropriate  
20 level of recreational harvest of seaweed while conserving the  
21 seaweed resource; and

22 3) Involve interested parties in development of the inventory  
23 and management plan, including the state parks and recreation  
24 commission, affected counties, private tideland owners, and  
25 representatives of those who harvest seaweed for personal use.

26 The department of natural resources shall involve members of  
27 the interested parties in subsection (3) above in development of  
28 the process and budget."

On page 2, line 13, strike "specie" and insert "species"

EFFECT: Corrects a spelling error. Applies the seaweed harvest limit to all public lands rather than to state lands only. Removes the requirement that a seaweed management plan be developed, and requires instead the development of a process and budget for an inventory and management plan. The process and budget are to be developed with interested parties, and submitted to the appropriate committees of the Legislature by December 31, 1993.
