- 12 (1) Private sector cultured aquatic salmon without identifying the
- 13 product as farm-raised salmon; or
- 14 (2) Commercially caught salmon designated as food fish under Title
- 15 75 RCW without identifying the product as commercially caught salmon.

- requirements of the bill. Removes advertising from the identification requirements. Exempts minced, pulverized, batter-coated, and breaded salmon from the requirements of the act. Removes the requirement that the origin of the fish be identified.
