- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that salmon consumers
- 8 in Washington benefit from knowing the species and origin of the salmon
- 9 they purchase. The accurate identification of such species, as well as
- 10 knowledge of the country or state of origin and of whether they were
- 11 caught commercially or were farm raised, is important to consumers.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 69.04 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
- 15 this section apply throughout sections 3 through 5 of this act.
- 16 (1) "Salmon" means all species of the genus Oncorhynchus, except
- 17 those classified as game fish in Title 77 RCW, and includes:
- 18 SCIENTIFIC NAME COMMON NAME
- 19 Oncorhynchus tshawytscha Chinook salmon or king salmon
- 20 Oncorhynchus kisutch Coho salmon or silver salmon
- 21 Oncorhynchus keta Chum salmon
- 22 Oncorhynchus gorbuscha Pink salmon
- 23 Oncorhynchus nerka Sockeye salmon
- 24 Salmo salar (in other than Atlantic salmon
- 25 its landlocked form)
- 26 (2) "Commercially caught" means salmon harvested by commercial
- 27 fishers.
- 28 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 69.04 RCW
- 29 to read as follows:
- 30 With the exception of a commercial fisher engaged in sales of fish
- 31 to a fish buyer, no person may sell any fresh or frozen salmon food
- 32 fish or cultured aquatic salmon without labeling the species of salmon
- 33 by its common name. A person knowingly violating this section is
- 34 guilty of misbranding under this chapter. A person who receives

- misleading and erroneous information about the species of salmon and
- subsequently labels or offers for wholesale or retail sale salmon that 2
- is inaccurately identified shall not be guilty of misbranding. 3
- 4 section shall not apply to salmon that is minced, pulverized, coated
- with batter, or breaded. 5
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 69.04 RCW 6
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 With the exception of a commercial fisher engaged in sales of fish
- 9 to a fish buyer, no person may sell any fresh or frozen:
- (1) Private sector cultured aquatic salmon without labeling the 10
- 11 product as farm raised salmon; or
- (2) Commercially caught salmon designated as food fish under Title 12
- 75 RCW without labeling the product as commercially caught salmon. 13
- 14 A person knowingly violating this section is guilty of misbranding
- 15 under this chapter. A person who receives misleading or erroneous
- 16 information about whether the salmon is farm raised or commercially
- caught, and subsequently labels or offers for wholesale or retail sale 17
- 18 salmon that is inaccurately identified shall not be guilty of
- 19 misbranding. This section shall not apply to salmon that is minced,
- pulverized, coated with batter, or breaded. 20
- 21 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 69.04 RCW
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 To promote honesty and fair dealing for consumers, the director, in
- 24 consultation with the director of the department of fisheries, shall
- 25 adopt rules:
- (1) Fixing and establishing a reasonable definition and standard of 26
- identity for salmon for purposes of selling and labeling salmon; 27
- 28 (2) Defining necessary documentation for purposes of enforcement;
- 29 and
- (3) Enforcing sections 3 and 4 of this act." 30
- **EFFECT:** Adds a legislative findings section. Adds additional 31 common names for chinook and coho salmon. Exempts commercial fishers 32
- 33 engaged in sales of fish to a fish buyer from the salmon labeling
- requirements of the bill. Removes advertising from the identification 34
- 35
- requirements. Exempts minced, pulverized, batter-coated, and breaded salmon from the requirements of the act. Removes the requirement that 36

- the origin of the fish be identified. Adds to the rule-making responsibility of the department of agriculture the requirement to define necessary documentation for purposes of enforcement.
