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- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that hungry children 8 do not come to school prepared to learn. It is of utmost importance
- 9 that all children be provided adequate time for meals and for basic
- 10 nutrition so that they may grow, be ready to learn, and be prepared to
- 11 compete in the future. The legislature intends that by the 1995-96
- 12 school year, breakfasts and lunches will be served in every public
- 13 school in the state.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.235.140 and 1989 c 239 s 2 are each amended to 15 read as follows:
- 16 (1) For the purposes of this section:
- 17 (a) <u>"School lunch programs" or "lunch programs" means a program</u>
- 18 meeting federal requirements defined in 42 U.S.C. Secs. 1751 through
- 19 1760 and 1779.
- 20 <u>(b)</u> "Free or reduced-price lunches" means lunches served by a
- 21 school district that qualify for federal reimbursement as free or
- 22 reduced-price lunches under the national school lunch program.
- 23 ((<del>(b)</del>)) <u>(c)</u> "School breakfast program" <u>or "breakfast program"</u> means
- 24 a program meeting federal requirements defined in 42 U.S.C. Secs. 1773
- 25 and 1779.
- 26 ((<del>c)</del> "Severe-need school" means a school that qualifies for a
- 27 severe need school reimbursement rate from federal funds for school
- 28 breakfasts served to children from low-income families.))
- 29 (2) ((School districts shall be required to develop and implement
- 30 plans for a school breakfast program in severe-need schools, pursuant
- 31 to the schedule in this section. For the second year prior to the
- 32 implementation of the district's school breakfast program, and for each
- 33 subsequent school year, each school district shall submit data enabling
- 34 the superintendent of public instruction to determine which schools
- 35 within the district will qualify as severe need schools. In developing

1 its plan, each school district shall consult with an advisory committee
2 including school staff and community members appointed by the board of
3 directors of the district.

 (3) Using district-wide data on school lunch participation during the 1988-89 school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall adopt a schedule for implementation of school breakfast programs in severe-need schools as follows:

(a) School districts where at least forty percent of lunches served to students are free or reduced price lunches shall submit a plan for implementation of a school breakfast program in severe need schools to the superintendent of public instruction no later than July 1, 1990. Each such district shall implement a school breakfast program in all severe need schools no later than the second day of school in the 1990-91 school year and in each school year thereafter.

(b) School districts where at least twenty-five but less than forty percent of lunches served to students are free or reduced-price lunches shall submit a plan for implementation of a school breakfast program in severe-need schools to the superintendent of public instruction no later than July 1, 1991. Each such district shall implement a school breakfast program in all severe-need schools no later than the second day of school in the 1991-92 school year and in each school year thereafter.

(c) School districts where less than twenty-five percent of lunches served to students are free or reduced-price lunches shall submit a plan for implementation of a school breakfast program in severe-need schools to the superintendent of public instruction no later than July 1, 1992. Each such district shall implement a school breakfast program in all severe-need schools no later than the second day of school in the 1992-93 school year and in each school year thereafter.

(d) School districts that did not offer a school lunch program in the 1988-89 school year are encouraged to implement such a program and to provide a school breakfast program in all severe-need schools when eligible.

(4) The requirements in this section shall lapse if the federal reimbursement rate for breakfasts served in severe-need schools is eliminated.

(5)) By April 15, 1994, school districts shall provide a school breakfast program in each school within the district that provided a school lunch program in the 1992-93 school year.

- 1 (3) By September 15, 1995, all school districts shall implement 2 either a breakfast or lunch program in all schools within the district 3 that do not have a breakfast or a lunch program.
- 4 (4) By September 15, 1996, all school districts shall provide both 5 a breakfast and lunch program in each school within the district.
- 6 (5) The superintendent of public instruction may grant a one-time
  7 waiver of the requirements of subsection (2), (3), or (4) of this
  8 section for up to two years upon the application of a school district
  9 that can demonstrate that implementation of the program in a school is
  10 not possible because food preparation, storage, or serving facilities
  11 are unavailable.
- 12 <u>(6) School districts are encouraged to use state agricultural</u>
  13 commodities for school breakfasts and lunches.
- 14 (7) Students who do not meet family-income criteria for free or 15 reduced-price breakfasts or lunches shall be eligible to participate in 16 the school breakfast and lunch programs established under this section, 17 and school districts may charge for the breakfasts and lunches served to these students. The requirement that school districts provide 18 19 school breakfast and lunch programs ((established)) under this section 20 ((shall be supported entirely by federal funds and commodities, charges to students, and other local resources available for this purpose, 21 and)) shall not create or imply any state funding obligation for these 22 The legislature does not intend to include these programs 23 24 within the state's obligation for basic education funding under Article 25 IX of the Constitution.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.235 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) To the extent funds are appropriated, the superintendent of public instruction may award grants to school districts to increase participation in school breakfast and lunch programs, to improve the quality of the programs, or to improve the equipment and facilities used in the programs. School districts shall demonstrate that they have applied for applicable federal funds before applying for funds under this subsection.
- 35 (2) To the extent funds are appropriated, the superintendent of 36 public instruction shall increase the state support for school 37 breakfasts and lunches.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.235
- 2 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 The superintendent of public instruction shall report annually each
- 4 January to the governor and the legislature on the following:
- 5 (1) The school districts and the schools within the district
- 6 serving school breakfasts and lunches as required under RCW
- 7 28A.235.140;
- 8 (2) The school districts and the names of the school board members
- 9 and school district superintendent for each school district that has
- 10 not met the requirements of RCW 28A.235.140;
- 11 (3) The school districts and schools for which waivers under RCW
- 12 28A.235.140(5) have been granted; and
- 13 (4) Information about the cost of providing school breakfast and
- 14 lunch programs and the amount of state and federal funding provided.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.235
- 16 RCW to read as follows:
- 17 (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall administer
- 18 available funds for the federal summer food service program.
- 19 (2) The superintendent of public instruction may award grants, to
- 20 the extent funds are appropriated, to eligible organizations to help
- 21 start new summer food service programs for children or to help expand
- 22 summer food services for children.
- 23 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28A.235.100 and 1990 c 33 s 245 are each amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 The superintendent of public instruction shall have power to
- 26 promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to effectuate the
- 27 purposes of ((RCW 28A.235.040 through 28A.235.110)) this chapter.
- 28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Section 4 of this act shall expire February
- 29 1, 1998.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** If specific funding for the purposes of this
- 31 act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided by June 30,
- 32 1993, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act shall be null and
- 33 void."
