- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 77.32 RCW 8 to read as follows:
- 9 The legislature finds that it is in the best interest of 10 recreational hunters and fishers in the state of Washington to be able 11 to purchase all recreational hunting and fishing licenses as a single 12 document. Under the combined department of fish and wildlife, there is 13 the opportunity to establish uniform license requirements and
- 15 There is created a sport recreational license, to be administered 16 by the department of fish and wildlife. The sport recreational license 17 shall include the personal use food fish, game fish, hunting, hound, and eastern Washington upland bird licenses, for residents and 18 nonresidents. The license shall also include three-day game fish and 19 20 food fish licenses, for residents and nonresidents. The license shall 21 include a warm water game fish surcharge, the funds from which shall be 22 deposited in the warm water game fish account, under chapter . . . 23 (Second Substitute Senate Bill No. 6206), Laws of 1994. The license may also include provisions for other special licenses, surcharges, or 24 25 enhancement stamps as needed.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 77.32 RCW to read as follows:
- The legislature finds that it is in the best interest of recreational hunters and fishers in the state of Washington to be able to purchase all recreational hunting and fishing licenses as a single document. Under the combined department of fish and wildlife, there is the opportunity to establish uniform license requirements and procedures.
- There is created a sport recreational license, to be administered by the department of fish and wildlife. The sport recreational license

- l shall include the personal use food fish, game fish, hunting, hound,
- 2 and eastern Washington upland bird licenses, for residents and
- 3 nonresidents. The license shall also include three-day game fish and
- 4 food fish licenses, for residents and nonresidents.

5 **Sec. 3.** RCW 75.08.011 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 20 and 1993 c 340 s 47 6 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

As used in this title or rules of the director, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- (1) "Director" means the director of fish and wildlife.
- 10 (2) "Department" means the department of fish and wildlife.
- 11 (3) "Person" means an individual or a public or private entity or 12 organization. The term "person" includes local, state, and federal 13 government agencies, and all business organizations, including 14 corporations and partnerships.
- 15 (4) "Fisheries patrol officer" means a person appointed and 16 commissioned by the director, with authority to enforce this title, 17 rules of the director, and other statutes as prescribed by the 18 legislature. Fisheries patrol officers are peace officers.
- 19 (5) "Ex officio fisheries patrol officer" means a commissioned officer of a municipal, county, state, or federal agency having as its 20 primary function the enforcement of criminal laws in general, while the 21 22 officer is in the appropriate jurisdiction. The term "ex officio 23 fisheries patrol officer" also includes wildlife agents, special agents 24 of the national marine fisheries service, United States fish and 25 wildlife special agents, state parks commissioned officers, department of natural resources enforcement officers, and United States forest 26 service officers, while the agents and officers are within their 27 28 respective jurisdictions.
- 29 (6) "To fish," "to harvest," and "to take" and their derivatives 30 mean an effort to kill, injure, harass, or catch food fish or 31 shellfish.
- 32 (7) "State waters" means all marine waters and fresh waters within 33 ordinary high water lines and within the territorial boundaries of the 34 state.
- 35 (8) "Offshore waters" means marine waters of the Pacific Ocean 36 outside the territorial boundaries of the state, including the marine 37 waters of other states and countries.

- 1 (9) "Concurrent waters of the Columbia river" means those waters of 2 the Columbia river that coincide with the Washington-Oregon state 3 boundary.
- (10) "Resident" means a person who has ((for the preceding ninety days)) maintained a permanent place of abode within the state for at least ninety days immediately preceding an application for a license, has established by formal evidence an intent to continue residing within the state, and who is not licensed to hunt or fish as a resident in another state.
- 10 (11) "Nonresident" means a person who has not fulfilled the 11 qualifications of a resident.
- 12 (12) "Food fish" means those species of the classes Osteichthyes, 13 Agnatha, and Chondrichthyes that <u>have been classified and that</u> shall 14 not be fished for except as authorized by rule of the director. The 15 term "food fish" includes all stages of development and the bodily 16 parts of food fish species.
- 17 (13) "Shellfish" means those species of marine and freshwater 18 invertebrates that <u>have been classified and that</u> shall not be taken 19 except as authorized by rule of the director. The term "shellfish" 20 includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of shellfish 21 species.
- 22 (14) "Salmon" means all species of the genus Oncorhynchus, except 23 those classified as game fish in Title 77 RCW, and includes:

- 30 (15) "Commercial" means related to or connected with buying, 31 selling, or bartering. Fishing for food fish or shellfish with gear 32 unlawful for fishing for personal use, or possessing food fish or 33 shellfish in excess of the limits permitted for personal use are 34 commercial activities.
- 35 (16) "To process" and its derivatives mean preparing or preserving 36 food fish or shellfish.
- 37 (17) "Personal use" means for the private use of the individual 38 taking the food fish or shellfish and not for sale or barter.

- (18) "Angling gear" means a line attached to a rod and reel capable 1 of being held in hand while landing the fish or a hand-held line 2 operated without rod or reel ((to which are attached no more than two 3 4 single hooks or one artificial bait with no more than four multiple 5 hooks)).
- (19) "Open season" means those times, manners of taking, and places 6 or waters established by rule of the director for the lawful fishing, 7 8 taking, or possession of food fish or shellfish. "Open season" 9 includes the first and last days of the established time.
- 10 (20) "Fishery" means the taking of one or more particular species of food fish or shellfish with particular gear in a particular 11 12 geographical area.
- 13 (21) "Limited-entry license" means a license subject to a license limitation program established in chapter 75.30 RCW. 14
- 15 (22) "Seaweed" means marine aquatic plant species that are dependent upon the marine aquatic or tidal environment, and exist in 16 either an attached or free floating form, and includes but is not 17 limited to marine aquatic plants in the classes Chlorophyta, 18 19 Phaeophyta, and Rhodophyta.
- Sec. 4. RCW 75.25.091 and 1993 sp.s. c 17 s 2 are each amended to 20 21 read as follows:
- (1) A personal use food fish license is required for all persons 22 23 other than residents under fifteen years of age((, honorably discharged 24 veterans with service-connected disabilities of thirty percent or more who have resided in the state for one year or more, or residents seventy years of age or older)) to fish for, take, or possess food fish for personal use from state waters or offshore waters. A personal use food fish license is not required under this section to fish for, take, or possess carp, smelt, or albacore.
- (2) The fees for annual personal use food fish licenses include the 30 one dollar regional fisheries enhancement surcharge imposed in RCW 31 75.50.100 and are as follows: 32
- 33 (a) For a resident fifteen years of age or older and under seventy 34 years of age, ((seven)) eight dollars; ((and))
- (b) For a resident seventy years of age or older, three dollars; 35 36 <u>and</u>
- 37 (c) For a nonresident, ((nineteen)) twenty dollars.

- 1 (3) The fee for a ((two-consecutive-day)) three-consecutive-day
  2 personal use food fish license is ((four)) five dollars, and includes
  3 the one-dollar regional fishery enhancement group surcharge imposed in
  4 RCW 75.50.100.
- 5 (4) An annual personal use food fish license is valid for a maximum 6 catch of fifteen salmon, after which another annual personal use food 7 fish license may be purchased.
- 8 (5) An annual personal use food fish license is valid for an annual
  9 maximum catch of fifteen sturgeon. No person may take more than
  10 fifteen sturgeon in any calendar year.
- 11 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.25.092 and 1993 sp.s. c 17 s 3 are each amended to 12 read as follows:
- (1) A personal use shellfish <u>and seaweed</u> license is required for all persons other than residents under fifteen years of age ((<del>or</del> honorably discharged veterans with service-connected disabilities of thirty percent or more who have resided in the state for one year or more)) to fish for, take, dig for, or possess <u>seaweed or</u> shellfish except crawfish (Pacifastacus sp.) for personal use from state waters or offshore waters including national park beaches.
- 20 (2) The fees for <u>annual</u> personal use shellfish <u>and seaweed</u> licenses 21 are:
- 22 (a) For a resident fifteen years of age or older and under seventy 23 years of age, five dollars;
- 24 (b) For a resident seventy years of age or older, three dollars; 25 and
- 26 (c) For a nonresident, twenty dollars.
- 27 (3) The fee for a ((two-consecutive-day)) three-consecutive-day 28 personal use shellfish and seaweed license is five dollars.
- 29 **Sec. 6.** RCW 75.25.110 and 1993 sp.s. c 17 s 6 are each amended to 30 read as follows:
- 31 (1) Any of the recreational fishing licenses required by this 32 chapter shall, upon ((request)) written application, be issued without 33 charge to the following individuals ((upon request)):
- 34 (a) ((Residents under fifteen years of age;
- (b))) Residents who ((submit applications attesting that they)) are ((a person sixty-five years of age or older who is an)) honorably discharged veterang of the United States armed forces and who are

- 1 <u>sixty-five years of age or older</u> with a service-connected disability
- 2 ((and who has been a resident of this state for the preceding ninety
- 3 <del>days</del>));
- 4 (b) Residents who are honorably discharged veterans of the United

- In concurrent waters of the Columbia river and in Washington
- 22 coastal territorial waters from the Oregon-Washington boundary to a
- 23 point five nautical miles north, an Oregon angling license comparable
- 24 to the Washington personal use food fish license or ((two-consecutive-
- 25 day)) three-consecutive-day personal use food fish license is valid if
- 26 Oregon recognizes as valid the Washington personal use food fish
- 27 license or ((two-consecutive-day)) three-consecutive-day personal use
- 28 food fish license in comparable Oregon waters.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. A new section is added to chapter 75.25 RCW to read as follows:
- The director shall by rule establish the conditions for issuance of duplicate licenses, permits, tags, stamps, and catch record cards required by this chapter. The fee for a duplicate provided under this section is ten dollars for those licenses that are ten dollars and
- 7 over, and for those licenses under ten dollars the duplicate fee is the
- 8 value of the license.
- 9 **Sec. 11.** RCW 77.32.161 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 2 are each amended to 10 read as follows:
- 11 A nonresident or resident may obtain a temporary fishing license,
- 12 which allows the holder to fish for game fish throughout the state for
- 13 <u>either</u> three ((<del>consecutive</del>)) days <u>or for one day</u>. The fee for ((<del>this</del>))
- 14 <u>a three-day</u> license is nine dollars for residents and seventeen dollars
- 15 for nonresidents. The fee for a one-day license is three dollars for
- 16 residents and seven dollars for nonresidents. The resident temporary
- 17 fishing license is not valid for an eight consecutive day period
- 18 beginning on the opening day of the lowland lake fishing season.
- 19 **Sec. 12.** RCW 77.32.101 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 1 are each amended to 20 read as follows:
- 21 (1) A <u>combination</u> hunting and fishing license allows a resident
- 22 holder to hunt, and to fish for game fish throughout the state. The
- 23 fee for this license is twenty-nine dollars.
- 24 (2) A hunting license allows the holder to hunt throughout the
- 25 state. The fee for this license is fifteen dollars for residents and
- 26 one hundred fifty dollars for nonresidents.
- 27 (3) A fishing license allows the holder to fish <u>for game fish</u>
- 28 throughout the state. The fee for this license is seventeen dollars
- 29 for residents fifteen years of age or older and under seventy years of
- 30 age, three dollars for residents seventy years of age or older, twenty
- 31 dollars for nonresidents under fifteen years of age, and forty-eight
- 32 dollars for nonresidents fifteen years of age or older.
- 33 (4) A steelhead fishing license allows the holder of a combination
- 34 <u>hunting and fishing license or a fishing license issued under this</u>
- 35 <u>section to fish for steelhead throughout the state. The fee for this</u>
- 36 <u>license is eighteen dollars.</u>

- (5) A juvenile steelhead license allows residents under fifteen 1 years of age and nonresidents under fifteen years of age who hold a 2 3 fishing license to fish for steelhead throughout the state. The fee 4 for this license is six dollars and entitles the holder to take up to five steelhead at which time another juvenile steelhead license may be 5 purchased. Any person who purchases a juvenile steelhead license is 6 prohibited from purchasing a steelhead license for the same calendar 7 8 <u>year.</u>
- 9 **Sec. 13.** RCW 77.32.230 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 5 are each amended to 10 read as follows:
- (1) A person sixty-five years of age or older who is an honorably discharged veteran of the United States armed forces having a service-connected disability and who ((has been)) is a resident ((for five years)) may receive upon written application a ((state)) hunting and fishing license free of charge.
- (2) Residents who are honorably discharged veterans of the United

  States armed forces with a thirty percent or more service-connected

  disability may receive upon written application a hunting and fishing

  license free of charge.
- 20 (3) An honorably discharged veteran who is a resident and is 21 confined to a wheelchair shall receive upon application a hunting 22 license free of charge.
- 23 <u>(4)</u> A ((<del>blind</del>)) person <u>who is blind</u>, or a person with a developmental disability as defined in RCW 71A.10.020 with documentation of the disability from the department of social and health services, or a physically handicapped person confined to a wheelchair may receive upon <u>written</u> application a fishing license free of charge.
- ((\(\frac{43}{3}\))) (5) A ((\(\frac{blind}{blind}\))) person who is blind or a physically handicapped person confined to a wheelchair who has been issued a card for a permanent disability under RCW 46.16.381 may use that card in place of a fishing license ((\(\frac{unless}{unless}\))), \(\frac{vanious}{vanious}\) permits, stamps, or punchcards are required by this chapter)).
- 34 (((4))) (6) A fishing license is not required for ((persons)) 35 residents under the age of fifteen.
- ((<del>(5)</del>)) <u>(7)</u> Tags, permits, stamps, and ((<del>punchcards</del>)) <u>steelhead</u> licenses required by this chapter shall be purchased separately by persons receiving a free or reduced-fee license.

- 1 (8) Licenses issued at no charge under this section shall be issued
- 2 from Olympia as provided by rule of the director, and are valid for
- 3 five years.
- 4 Sec. 14. RCW 77.32.256 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 7 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 The director shall by rule establish the conditions for issuance of
- 7 duplicate licenses, <u>rebates</u>, permits, tags, stamps, and ((<del>punchcards</del>))
- 8 <u>catch record cards</u> required by this chapter. The fee for a duplicate
- 9 provided under this section is ten dollars for those licenses that are
- 10 ten dollars and over, and for those licenses under ten dollars the
- 11 <u>duplicate fee is the value of the license</u>.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 15.** All licenses issued by the department of
- 13 fisheries under Title 75 RCW or issued by the department of wildlife
- 14 under Title 77 RCW shall be recognized as valid by the department of
- 15 fish and wildlife until the stated expiration date.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 16.** Section 15 of this act shall take effect
- 17 July 1, 1994.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 17.** Sections 3 through 14 of this act shall
- 19 take effect July 1, 1995.
- 20 NEW SECTION. Sec. 18. Section 1 of this act shall take effect
- 21 July 1, 1995, if Second Substitute Senate Bill No. 6206 becomes law by
- 22 June 30, 1994, otherwise section 1 of this act shall not take effect.
- 23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 19.** Section 2 of this act shall take effect
- 24 July 1, 1995, if Second Substitute Senate Bill No. 6206 does not become
- 25 law by June 30, 1994, otherwise section 2 of this act shall not take
- 26 effect."
