- 9 ((A person who files a declaration of candidacy for the office of sheriff after September 1, 1979, shall have, within twelve months of 10 assuming office, a certificate of completion of a basic law enforcement 11 12 training program which complies with standards adopted by the criminal 13 justice training commission pursuant to RCW 43.101.080 and 43.101.160.
- This requirement does not apply to persons holding the office of 15 sheriff in any county on September 1, 1979.)) (1) On and after November
- 16 9, 1994, except as otherwise provided in this section, no person is
- eligible to be a candidate for sheriff or hold the office of sheriff 17
- and no person may be elected or appointed to the office of sheriff or 18
- continue to hold the office of sheriff unless at the time of filing the 19
- 20 person:
- 21 (a) Is a registered voter in the county in which the candidate is filing; 22
- 23 (b) Has been awarded a high school diploma or a recognized equivalent of a high school diploma; 24
- (c) Has not been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a felony under 25 the laws of this state, another state, or the United States; 26
- 27 (d) Has not been convicted of a gross misdemeanor or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past ten years; 28
- (e) Has been fingerprinted by the state patrol within the last 29 sixty days; 30
- (f) Has a certificate of completion of a basic law enforcement 31
- training program which complies with standards adopted by the criminal 32
- justice training commission pursuant to RCW 43.101.080. Completion of 33
- 34 the state patrol's academy shall constitute meeting the standards set
- by the criminal justice training commission. If the certificate of 35
- 36 completion is not obtained prior to the date of assuming office, the

- 13 sheriff. When an appointment is being made to the office of sheriff,
- 14 the appointing authority must seek individuals who are qualified under
- 15 this section. However, this section may be waived when there are no

- 17 (2)(a) If the county auditor determines that a candidate does not

- 32 (4) For the purposes of this section, "county auditor" has the
- 33 meaning provided in RCW 29.01.043.
- 34 (5) The Washington state patrol shall search local, state, and
- 35 <u>national fingerprint files to disclose any criminal record as described</u>
- 36 in subsection (1) (c) and (d) of this section. If such an offense is

- 1 discovered, the state patrol shall notify the county auditor for the
- 2 county in which the sheriff candidate is running or holds office."
