- (b) In studying eligibility for state financial aid programs, consider sheltering home equity on a family's principal place of residence, and sheltering a reasonable portion of savings and farm or business net worth, each insofar as is permissible under state and federal law;

- (d) Strive to preserve a range of educational options for needystudents, including choice of institutions and programs;
