25 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The legislature recognizes that the use of
26 alcohol and other drugs during pregnancy can cause medical,
27 psychological, and social problems for women and infants. The
28 legislature further recognizes that communities are increasingly
29 concerned about this problem and the associated costs to the mothers,
30 infants, and society as a whole. The legislature recognizes that the
31 department of health and other agencies are focusing on primary

1 prevention activities to reduce the use of alcohol or drugs during
2 pregnancy but few efforts have focused on secondary prevention efforts
3 aimed at intervening in the lives of women already involved in the use
4 of alcohol or other drugs during pregnancy. The legislature recognizes
5 that the best way to prevent problems for chemically dependent pregnant
6 women and their resulting children is to engage the women in alcohol or
7 drug treatment. The legislature acknowledges that treatment
8 professionals find pretreatment services to clients to be important in
9 engaging women in alcohol or drug treatment. The legislature further
10 recognizes that pretreatment services should be provided at locations
11 where chemically dependent women are likely to be found, including
12 correctional facilities, public health clinics, and domestic violence
13 or homeless shelters. Therefore the legislature intends to prevent the
14 detrimental effects of alcohol or other drug use to women and their
15 resulting infants by promoting the establishment of local programs to
16 help facilitate a woman's entry into alcohol or other drug treatment.
17 These programs shall provide secondary prevention services and
18 provision of opportunities for immediate treatment so that women who
19 seek help are welcomed rather than ostracized.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** Unless the context clearly requires
21 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
22 chapter.

23 (1) "Alcoholism" means a disease, characterized by a dependency on
24 alcoholic beverages, loss of control over the amount and circumstances
25 of alcohol use, symptoms of tolerance, physiological or psychological
26 withdrawal, or both, if use is reduced or discontinued and impairment
27 of health or disruption of social or economic functioning.

28 (2) "Approved treatment program" means a discrete program of
29 chemical dependency treatment provided by a treatment program certified
30 by the department of social and health services as meeting standards
31 adopted under this chapter.

32 (3) "Assessment" means an interview with an individual to determine
33 if he or she is chemically dependent and in need of referral to an
34 approved treatment program.

35 (4) "Chemically dependent individual" means someone suffering from
36 alcoholism or drug addiction, or dependence on alcohol or one or more
37 other psychoactive chemicals.

1 (5) "Department" means the department of social and health
2 services.

3 (6) "Domestic violence" is a categorization of offenses, as defined
4 in RCW 10.99.020, committed by one family or household member against
5 another.

6 (7) "Domestic violence program" means a shelter or other program
7 which provides services to victims of domestic violence.

8 (8) "Drug addiction" means a disease characterized by a dependency
9 on psychoactive chemicals, loss of control over the amount and
10 circumstances of use, symptoms of tolerance, physiological or
11 psychological withdrawal, or both, if use is reduced or discontinued,
12 and impairment of health or disruptions of social or economic
13 functioning.

14 (9) "Family or household members" means a family or household
15 member as defined in RCW 10.99.020.

16 (10) "Pretreatment" means the period of time prior to an
17 individual's enrollment in alcohol or drug treatment.

18 (11) "Pretreatment services" means activities taking place prior to
19 treatment that include identification of individuals using alcohol or
20 drugs, education, assessment of their use, evaluation of need for
21 treatment, referral to an approved treatment program, and advocacy on
22 a client's behalf with social service agencies or others to ensure and
23 coordinate a client's entry into treatment.

24 (12) "Primary prevention" means providing information about the
25 effects of alcohol or drug use to individuals so they will avoid using
26 these substances.

27 (13) "Secondary prevention" means identifying and obtaining an
28 assessment on individuals using alcohol or other drugs for referral to
29 treatment when indicated.

30 (14) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of social
31 and health services.

32 (15) "Treatment" means the broad range of emergency detoxification,
33 residential, and outpatient services and care, including diagnostic
34 evaluation, chemical dependency education and counseling, medical,
35 psychiatric, psychological, and social service care, vocational
36 rehabilitation, and career counseling, that may be extended to
37 chemically dependent individuals and their families.

1 (16) "Treatment program" means an organization, institution, or
2 corporation, public or private, engaged in the care, treatment, or
3 rehabilitation of chemically dependent individuals.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** The secretary shall develop and promote
5 state-wide secondary prevention strategies designed to increase the use
6 of alcohol and drug treatment services by women of child-bearing age,
7 before, during, and immediately after pregnancy. These efforts are
8 conducted through the division of alcohol and substance abuse. The
9 secretary shall:

10 (1) Promote development of four pilot demonstration projects in the
11 state to be called pretreatment projects for women of child bearing
12 age. Two of the pilot projects are in urban areas and two are in rural
13 areas.

14 (2) Ensure that two of the projects are located in public health
15 department clinics that provide maternity services, one is located in
16 a county correctional facility, and one is located with a domestic
17 violence program.

18 (3) Hire four certified chemical dependency counselors to work as
19 substance abuse educators in each of the four demonstration projects.
20 The counselors may rotate between more than one clinic, correctional
21 facility, or domestic violence program. The counselor for the domestic
22 violence program shall also be trained in domestic violence issues.

23 (4) Ensure that the duties and activities of the certified chemical
24 dependency counselors include, at a minimum, the following:

25 (a) Identifying substance-using pregnant women in the health
26 clinics, correctional facilities, and domestic violence programs;

27 (b) Educating the women and agency staff on the effects of alcohol
28 or drugs on health, pregnancy, and unborn children;

29 (c) Determining the extent of the women's substance use;

30 (d) Evaluating the women's need for treatment;

31 (e) Making referrals for chemical dependency treatment if
32 indicated;

33 (f) Facilitating the women's entry into treatment; and

34 (g) Advocating on the client's behalf with other social service
35 agencies or others to ensure and coordinate clients into treatment.

36 (5) Ensure that administrative costs of the department are limited
37 to ten percent of the funds appropriated for the project.
