- 31 subsection (4) of this section.
- 32 (2) Treatment authorized by this section must be prescribed by a
- 33 health care practitioner licensed under Title 18 RCW and who has
- 34 prescriptive authority, acting within the scope of his or her license,
- 35 and may be administered only after proper training as specified in

- 37 (3) The nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) shall

- receive the training specified in this subsection. The person conducting the training must be a registered nurse licensed under chapter 18.88 RCW. A registered nurse shall not be subject to any reprisal or disciplinary action for refusing to provide the training required under this section. Training shall include the following:

- 13 (c) Written instructions for performance of the task for the 14 nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) to use as a reference;
- (d) Instructions to the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) that the task being taught is specific to this client only and is not transferable to other clients or taught to other care providers;
- 19 (e) Documentation of how the task was taught, the teaching outcome, the content and type of instructions left for the nursing assistant 20 defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5), evidence that the nursing assistant 21 defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) understands risks involved in performing 22 the task and has a plan for how to respond to the consequences, and 23 24 evidence that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) was 25 instructed that the task is client-specific and not transferable to 26 other clients or providers;
- 27 (f) Performance of the administration of medications or treatments 28 by nursing assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) authorized in this 29 section shall be reviewed at least annually by a registered nurse.
- (4) A registered nurse may delegate administration of gastrostomy, but not nasogastric, tube feedings to a nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) specific to one client under the following conditions:
- 34 (a) The registered nurse shall consider the nature of the task to 35 be provided, its complexity, risk involved, and the necessary skill 36 needed;
- 37 (b) The registered nurse shall assess the client's condition and 38 determine that there is not a significant risk to the client if the 39 nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) performs the task in the

1 absence of direct supervision;

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- 2 (c) The registered nurse shall determine how frequently the 3 client's condition shall be reassessed to determine the appropriateness 4 of the continued delegation of the task to a nursing assistant defined 5 in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- 6 (d) If there is some risk involved to the client, the registered 7 nurse shall determine that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 8 18.88A.020(5) is prepared to respond effectively to the consequences;
- 9 (e) The registered nurse shall assess the ability of the nursing 10 assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) to perform the task;
- 11 (f) The registered nurse shall determine the frequency of 12 supervision of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- (g) The registered nurse shall document the process for deciding that the task can be safely delegated for the specific client to the specific nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- (h) The registered nurse shall document how frequently the client should be reassessed by a registered nurse regarding continued delegation of the task to the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
 - (i) The responsibility, accountability, and authority of the registered nurse shall be limited to teaching and delegation of administration of gastrostomy tube feeding to the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5), and the determination of which nursing assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) and the number of nursing assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) that must be taught and delegated the task of administration of gastrostomy tube feedings shall remain with the registered nurse;
- (j) The number of persons to whom the tasks are taught and delegated shall be limited to the number that can be safely supervised by the registered nurse; and
- 31 (k) The registered nurse shall assure that the nursing assistant 32 defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) maintains proficiency in performing the 33 tasks through periodic supervision, and reviews conducted at least 34 annually, by the registered nurse.
- 35 (5) The delegating registered nurse has a responsibility to 36 determine that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) is 37 indeed competent to perform the delegated act. Nonnursing and 38 managerial persons shall not coerce the registered nurse into 39 compromising client safety by requiring the registered nurse to

- 1 delegate. Both the delegating registered nurse and the nursing 2 assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) are accountable for their own 3 actions in the delegation process.
- 4 (6) Verification of the current registration of a person holding 5 himself or herself out to be a nursing assistant defined in RCW 6 18.88A.020(5) and any restrictions relating to the registration shall 7 be the responsibility of the employer of the nursing assistant defined 8 in RCW 18.88A.020(5).
- 9 (7) Development of rules implementing subsections (2), (3), (4), 10 and (5) of this section shall be jointly adopted by the department of social and health services and the Washington state board of nursing.

- (11) "Supervision of nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020" 31 means the provision of guidance and evaluation by a qualified 32 registered nurse for the accomplishment of the specific tasks 33 34 enumerated in section 5 of this act with the initial direction of the task or activity, periodic inspection of the actual act of 35 accomplishing the task or activity, and the authority to require 36 37 corrective action. The licensed registered nurse is not required to be 38 on the premises but has given oral and written instructions relating to 39 the specific task or activity and the client has been assessed by the
