- 9 (1) Competitive bidding procedures may be waived by resolution of 10 the governing body of the municipality for:
- 11 (a) Purchases that are clearly and legitimately limited to a single 12 source of supply;
- 13 (b) Purchases involving unique facilities, services, or market 14 conditions;

If a contract is awarded without competitive bidding due to an emergency, the governing body of the municipality must adopt the resolution required pursuant to (a) of this subsection at either a regular or special meeting no later than two weeks following the award of the contract.
- 32 (3) For purposes of this section, "emergency" means unforeseen 33 circumstances beyond the control of the municipality that either: (a) 34 Present a real, immediate threat to the proper performance of essential 35 functions of the municipality; or (b) will likely result in material

- loss or damage to property, bodily injury, or loss of life if immediate action is not taken.
- 3 (4) This section supplements and does not limit the authority of 4 any particular type or class of municipality to provide exemptions from 5 competitive bidding procedures as authorized by statute.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.335.190 and 1990 c 33 s 362 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (1) When, in the opinion of the board of directors of any school district, the cost of any furniture, supplies, equipment, building, 9 improvements, or repairs, or other work or purchases, except books, 10 will equal or exceed the sum of twenty thousand dollars, complete plans 11 12 and specifications for such work or purchases shall be prepared and 13 notice ((by publication given)) published in at least one newspaper of 14 general circulation within the district((, once each week for two consecutive weeks,)) of the intention to receive bids therefor ((and)). 15 The notice must include a statement that specifications and other 16 information may be examined at the office of the board or any other 17 18 officially designated location((: PROVIDED, That)). The notice shall be published at least once at least thirteen days prior to the last 19 date upon which bids will be received. The board, however, without 20 giving such notice may make improvements or repairs to the property of 21 22 the district through the shop and repair department of such district 23 when the total of such improvements or repair does not exceed the sum 24 of seventy-five hundred dollars. The cost of any public work, 25 improvement or repair for the purposes of this section shall be the aggregate of all amounts to be paid for labor, material, and equipment 26 on one continuous or interrelated project where work is to be performed 27 simultaneously or in close sequence. The bids shall be in writing and 28 29 shall be opened and read in public on the date and in the place named 30 in the notice and after being opened shall be filed for public inspection. 31
- 32 (2) Every purchase of furniture, equipment or supplies, except
 33 books, the cost of which is estimated to be in excess of seventy-five
 34 hundred dollars, shall be on a competitive basis. ((The board of
 35 directors shall establish a procedure for securing telephone and/or
 36 written quotations for such purchases.)) Whenever the estimated cost
 37 is from seventy-five hundred dollars up to twenty thousand dollars, the
 38 ((procedure shall require quotations from at least three different

sources to be obtained in writing or by telephone, and recorded for public perusal)) board may by resolution use the uniform process provided in RCW 39.04.190 to award contracts. Whenever the estimated cost is in excess of twenty thousand dollars, the public bidding process provided in subsection (1) of this section shall be followed.

- (3) Every building, improvement, repair or other public works project, the cost of which is estimated to be in excess of seventy-five hundred dollars, shall be ((on)) awarded by a competitive bid process. ((All such projects)) The board may use the small works roster process provided in RCW 39.04.155 to award contracts for public works with an estimated ((to be)) value of less than twenty thousand dollars ((may be awarded to a contractor on the small works roster. The small works roster shall be comprised of all responsible contractors who have requested to be on the list. The board of directors shall establish a procedure for securing telephone and/or written quotations from the contractors on the small works roster to assure establishment of a competitive price and for awarding contracts to the lowest responsible bidder. Such procedure shall require that a good faith effort be made to request quotations from all contractors on the small works roster who have indicated the capability of performing the kind of public works being contracted. Immediately after an award is made, the bid quotations obtained shall be recorded, open to public inspection, and available by telephone inquiry. The small works roster shall be revised at least once each year by publishing notice of such opportunity in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the district. Responsible contractors shall be added to the list at any time they submit a written request)). Whenever the estimated cost of a public works project is twenty thousand dollars or more, the public bidding process provided in subsection (1) of this section shall be followed.
- (4) The contract for the work or purchase shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder as defined in RCW 43.19.1911 but the board may by resolution reject any and all bids and make further calls for bids in the same manner as the original call. On any work or purchase the board shall provide bidding information to any qualified bidder or the bidder's agent, requesting it in person.
- (5) ((In the event of any emergency when the public interest or property of the district would suffer material injury or damage by delay, upon resolution of the board declaring the existence of such an

- emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the board may 1 waive the requirements of this section with reference to any purchase 2 or contract: PROVIDED, That an "emergency", for the purposes of this 3 4 section, means a condition likely to result in immediate physical 5 injury to persons or to property of the school district in the absence of prompt remedial action.)) The board may waive the requirements of 6 7 this section pursuant to section 1 of this act if an exemption 8 contained within that section applies to the work or contract.
- 9 **Sec. 3.** RCW 35.22.620 and 1993 c 198 s 9 are each amended to read 10 as follows:
- 11 (1) As used in this section, the term "public works" means as 12 defined in RCW 39.04.010.
- (2) A first class city may have public works performed by contract 13 14 pursuant to public notice and call for competitive bids. As limited by subsection (3) of this section, a first class city may have public 15 16 works performed by city employees in any annual or biennial budget period equal to a dollar value not exceeding ten percent of the public 17 18 works construction budget, including any amount in a supplemental public works construction budget, over the budget period. The amount 19 of public works that a first class city has a county perform for it 20 under RCW 35.77.020 shall be included within this ten percent 21 22 limitation.

Twenty percent of the motor vehicle fuel tax distributions to that city shall be withheld if two years after the year in which the excess amount of work occurred, the city has failed to so reduce the amount of public works that it has performed by public employees. The amount so withheld shall be distributed to the city when it has demonstrated in its reports to the state auditor that the amount of public works it has performed by public employees has been so reduced.
- Whenever a first class city has had public works performed in any budget period up to the maximum permitted amount for that budget period, all remaining public works within that budget period shall be

The state auditor shall report to the state treasurer any first class city that exceeds this amount and the extent to which the city has or has not reduced the amount of public works it has performed by public employees in subsequent years.

If the bidder fails to enter into the contract in accordance with his or her bid and furnish a bond within ten days from the date at which he or she is notified that he or she is the successful bidder, the check or postal money order and the amount thereof shall be forfeited to the council or

All material required by a port district may be procured in the open market or by contract and all work ordered may be done by contract or day labor. All such contracts for work, the estimated cost of which exceeds one hundred thousand dollars, shall be let at public bidding upon notice published in a newspaper of general circulation in the district at least thirteen days before the last date upon which bids will be received, calling for sealed bids upon the work, plans and specifications for which shall then be on file in the office of the commission for public inspection. The same notice may call for bids on such work or material based upon plans and specifications submitted by the bidder. The requirements of this section may be waived pursuant to section 1 of this act if an exemption contained within that section applies to the work or contract.

Each port district shall maintain a small works roster, as provided in RCW 39.04.155, and may use the small works roster process to award contracts in lieu of calling for sealed bids whenever work is done by contract, the estimated cost of which is one hundred thousand dollars or less. Whenever possible, the managing official shall invite at

1 least one proposal from a minority contractor who shall otherwise 2 qualify under this section.

When awarding such a contract for work, when utilizing proposals from the small works roster, the managing official shall give weight to the contractor submitting the lowest and best proposal, and whenever it would not violate the public interest, such contracts shall be distributed equally among contractors, including minority contractors, on the small works roster.

9 **Sec. 8.** RCW 54.04.070 and 1993 c 198 s 14 are each amended to read 10 as follows:

Any item, or items of the same kind of materials, equipment, or 11 supplies purchased, the estimated cost of which is in excess of five 12 13 thousand dollars, exclusive of sales tax shall be by contract: 14 PROVIDED, That a district may make purchases of the same kind of items 15 of materials, equipment and supplies not exceeding five thousand 16 dollars in any calendar month without a contract, purchasing any excess thereof over five thousand dollars by contract. Any work ordered by a 17 18 district commission, the estimated cost of which is in excess of ten thousand dollars exclusive of sales tax, shall be by contract, except 19 that a district commission may have its own regularly employed 20 personnel perform work which is an accepted industry practice under 21 prudent utility management without a contract. 22 Prudent utility 23 management means performing work with regularly employed personnel 24 utilizing material of a worth not exceeding fifty thousand dollars in 25 value without a contract: PROVIDED, That such limit on the value of material being utilized in work being performed by regularly employed 26 27 personnel shall not include the value of individual items of equipment purchased or acquired and used as one unit of a project. Before 28 29 awarding such a contract, the commission shall publish a notice once or more in a newspaper of general circulation in the district at least 30 thirteen days before the last date upon which bids will be received, 31 inviting sealed proposals for the work or materials; plans and 32 specifications of which shall at the time of the publication be on file 33 at the office of the district subject to public inspection. 34 Any published notice ordering work to be performed for the district shall 35 36 be mailed at the time of publication to any established trade association which files a written request with the district to receive 37 38 such notices. The commission may at the same time and as part of the

same notice, invite tenders for the work or materials upon plans and specifications to be submitted by the bidders.

Notwithstanding any other provisions herein, all contract projects, the estimated cost of which is less than one hundred thousand dollars, may be awarded to a contractor using the small works roster process provided in RCW 39.04.155. All contract projects equal to or in excess of one hundred thousand dollars shall be let by competitive bidding.

Whenever equipment or materials required by a district are held by a governmental agency and are available for sale but such agency is unwilling to submit a proposal, the commission may ascertain the price of such items and file a statement of such price supported by the sworn affidavit of one member of the commission and may consider such price as a bid without a deposit or bond. ((In the event of an emergency when the public interest or property of the district would suffer material injury or damage by delay, upon resolution of the commission, or proclamation of an official designated by the board to act for the board during such emergencies, declaring the existence of such emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the board, or the official acting for the board, may waive the requirements of this chapter with reference to any purchase or contract, after having taken precautions to secure the lowest price practicable under the circumstances.

After determination by the commission during a public meeting that a particular purchase is available clearly and legitimately only from a single source of supply, the bidding requirements of this section may be waived by the commission.))

The commission may waive the requirements of this section pursuant to section 1 of this act if an exemption contained within that section applies to the work or contract.

Sec. 9. RCW 56.08.070 and 1993 c 198 s 16 and 1993 c 45 s 4 are 31 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) All materials purchased and work ordered, the estimated cost of which is in excess of five thousand dollars shall be let by contract. All contract projects, the estimated cost of which is less than fifty thousand dollars, may be awarded to a contractor using the small works roster process provided in RCW 39.04.155 or the process provided in RCW 39.04.190 for purchases. The board of sewer commissioners may set up uniform procedures to prequalify contractors for inclusion on the small

works roster. All contract projects equal to or in excess of fifty 1 2 thousand dollars shall be let by competitive bidding. Before awarding any competitive contract the board of sewer commissioners shall publish 3 4 a notice in a newspaper of general circulation where the district is located at least once, thirteen days before the last date upon which 5 bids will be received, inviting sealed proposals for such work, plans 6 7 and specifications which must at the time of publication of such notice 8 be on file in the office of the board of sewer commissioners subject to 9 public inspection. - 14 (1) The board of water commissioners shall have authority to create 15 and fill such positions and fix salaries and bonds thereof as it may by 16 resolution provide.
