- A person shall be exempt from any legal obligation to pay all or a portion of the amount of excess and regular real property taxes due and payable in the year following the year in which a claim is filed, and thereafter, in accordance with the following:
- 13 (1) The property taxes must have been imposed upon a residence which was occupied by the person claiming the exemption as a principal 14 15 place of residence as of January 1st of the year for which the 16 exemption is claimed: PROVIDED, That any person who sells, transfers, 17 or is displaced from his or her residence may transfer his or her exemption status to a replacement residence, but no claimant shall 18 19 receive an exemption on more than one residence in any year: PROVIDED FURTHER, That confinement of the person to a hospital or nursing home 20 shall not disqualify the claim of exemption if: 21
- 22 (a) The residence is temporarily unoccupied;
- 23 (b) The residence is occupied by a spouse and/or a person 24 financially dependent on the claimant for support; or
- (c) The residence is rented for the purpose of paying nursing home or hospital costs;
- 27 (2) The person claiming the exemption must have owned, at the time of filing, in fee, as a life estate, or by contract purchase, the 28 residence on which the property taxes have been imposed or if the 29 30 person claiming the exemption lives in a cooperative housing association, corporation, or partnership, such person must own a share 31 32 therein representing the unit or portion of the structure in which he or she resides. For purposes of this subsection, a residence owned by 33 34 a marital community or owned by cotenants shall be deemed to be owned by each spouse or cotenant, and any lease for life shall be deemed a 35 36 life estate;

(3) The person claiming the exemption must be sixty-one years of age or older on December 31st of the year in which the exemption claim is filed, or must have been, at the time of filing, retired from 4 regular gainful employment by reason of physical disability: PROVIDED, That any surviving spouse of a person who was receiving an exemption at the time of the person's death shall qualify if the surviving spouse is fifty-seven years of age or older and otherwise meets the requirements of this section;

- 9 (4) The amount that the person shall be exempt from an obligation 10 to pay shall be calculated on the basis of combined disposable income, as defined in RCW 84.36.383. If the person claiming the exemption was 11 retired for two months or more of the preceding year, the combined 12 disposable income of such person shall be calculated by multiplying the 13 average monthly combined disposable income of such person during the 14 15 months such person was retired by twelve. If the income of the person claiming exemption is reduced for two or more months of the preceding 16 year by reason of the death of the person's spouse, the combined 17 disposable income of such person shall be calculated by multiplying the 18 19 average monthly combined disposable income of such person after the 20 death of the spouse by twelve.
- (5)(a) A person who otherwise qualifies under this section and has 21 a combined disposable income of ((twenty-six)) twenty-eight thousand 22 dollars or less shall be exempt from all excess property taxes; and 23
 - (b)(i) A person who otherwise qualifies under this section and has a combined disposable income of eighteen thousand dollars or less but greater than fifteen thousand dollars shall be exempt from all regular property taxes on the greater of thirty thousand dollars or thirty percent of the valuation of his or her residence, but not to exceed fifty thousand dollars of the valuation of his or her residence; or
- 30 (ii) A person who otherwise qualifies under this section and has a 31 combined disposable income of fifteen thousand dollars or less shall be exempt from all regular property taxes on the greater of thirty-four 32 thousand dollars or fifty percent of the valuation of his or her 33 34 residence.
- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Section 1 of this act shall be effective for 35 36 taxes levied for collection in 1995 and thereafter.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. If a court enters a final order invalidating or remanding section 1 of this act on the grounds that it does not comply with section 13, chapter 2, Laws of 1994, this measure shall be submitted to the people for their adoption, ratification, or rejection, at the next succeeding general election to be held in this state, in accordance with Article II, section 1 of the state Constitution, as amended, and the laws adopted to facilitate the operation thereof."
