5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the
6 following:

7 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that additional cost
8 savings can be realized by simplifying the department of fisheries
9 recreational licensing system. The legislature finds that significant
10 benefits will accrue to recreational fishers from streamlining the
11 department of fisheries recreational licensing system. The legislature
12 finds recreational license fees and commercial landing taxes have not
13 been increased in recent years. The legislature finds that reduction
14 in important department of fisheries programs can be avoided by
15 increasing license fees and commercial landing taxes. The legislature
16 finds that it is in the best interest of the state to avoid significant
17 reductions in current department of fisheries activities.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 75.25 RCW
19 to read as follows:

20 (1) A personal use food fish license is required for all persons
21 other than residents under fifteen years of age or residents seventy
22 years of age or older to fish for, take, or possess food fish for
23 personal use from state waters or offshore waters. A personal use food
24 fish license is not required under this section to fish for, take, or
25 possess carp, smelt, or albacore.

26 (2) The fees for personal use food fish licenses are:

27 (a) For a resident fifteen years of age or older and under seventy
28 years of age, seven dollars; and

29 (b) For a nonresident, nineteen dollars.

30 (3) The fee for a two-consecutive-day personal use food fish
31 license is four dollars.

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 75.25 RCW
33 to read as follows:

1 (1) A personal use shellfish license is required for all persons
2 other than residents under fifteen years of age to fish for, take, dig
3 for, or possess shellfish for personal use from state waters or
4 offshore waters including national park beaches.

5 (2) The fees for personal use shellfish licenses are:

6 (a) For a resident fifteen years of age or older and under seventy
7 years of age, five dollars;

8 (b) For a resident seventy years of age or older, three dollars;
9 and

10 (c) For a nonresident, twenty dollars.

11 (3) The fee for a two-consecutive-day personal use shellfish
12 license is five dollars.

13 **Sec. 4.** RCW 75.25.005 and 1989 c 305 s 1 are each amended to read
14 as follows:

15 The following recreational fishing licenses are administered and
16 issued by the department of fisheries under authority of the director
17 of fisheries:

18 (1) (~~((Hood Canal shrimp license))~~) Personal use food fish license;
19 and

20 (2) (~~((Razor clam license;~~

21 ~~(3) Personal use fishing license;~~

22 ~~(4) Salmon license;~~ and

23 ~~(5) Sturgeon license))~~ Personal use shellfish and seaweed license.

24 **Sec. 5.** RCW 75.25.080 and 1989 c 305 s 4 are each amended to read
25 as follows:

26 (1) It is lawful to (~~((dig))~~) fish for, take, or possess the
27 personal-use daily bag limit of (~~((razor clams))~~) shellfish or food fish
28 for (~~((another))~~) a disabled person if (~~((that person has))~~) the harvester
29 is licensed and if the disabled person is licensed and present on site
30 and in possession of a physical disability permit issued by the
31 director.

32 (2) An application for a physical disability permit must be
33 submitted on a department of fisheries official form and must be
34 accompanied by a licensed medical doctor's certification of disability.

35 (3) A person with a physical disability permit is not required to
36 be present at the location where another person is digging razor clams
37 for the disabled person. The physical disability permittee is required

1 to be in the direct line of sight of the person digging razor clams for
2 him or her, unless it is not possible to be in a direct line of sight
3 because of a physical obstruction or other barrier. If such a barrier
4 or obstruction exists, the physical disability permittee is required to
5 be within one-quarter mile of the person who is digging razor clams for
6 him or her.

7 **Sec. 6.** RCW 75.25.110 and 1989 c 305 s 8 are each amended to read
8 as follows:

9 (1) Any of the recreational fishing licenses required by this
10 chapter shall, upon request, be issued without charge to the following
11 individuals upon request:

12 (a) Residents under fifteen years of age (~~and residents seventy~~
13 ~~years of age or older~~);

14 (b) Residents who submit applications attesting that they are a
15 person sixty-five years of age or older who is an honorably discharged
16 veteran of the United States armed forces with a service-connected
17 disability and who has been a resident of this state for the preceding
18 ninety days;

19 (c) A blind person;

20 (d) A person with a developmental disability as defined in RCW
21 71A.10.020 with documentation of the disability from the department of
22 social and health services; and

23 (e) A person who is physically handicapped and confined to a
24 wheelchair.

25 (~~(2) (Personal use licenses, salmon licenses, and sturgeon licenses~~
26 ~~shall, upon request, be issued to nonresidents under fifteen years of~~
27 ~~age.~~

28 ~~(3))~~ A blind person or a physically handicapped person confined to
29 a wheelchair who has been issued a card for a permanent disability
30 under RCW 46.16.381 may use that card in place of a fishing license
31 (~~(unless a punchcard is required by the director)).~~

32 **Sec. 7.** RCW 75.25.120 and 1989 c 305 s 9 are each amended to read
33 as follows:

34 In concurrent waters of the Columbia river and in Washington
35 coastal territorial waters from the Oregon-Washington boundary to a
36 point five nautical miles north, an Oregon angling license comparable
37 to the Washington personal use food fish license(~~(7)~~) or two-

1 consecutive-day personal use food fish license(~~((, salmon license, or~~
2 ~~sturgeon license))~~) is valid if Oregon recognizes as valid the
3 Washington personal use food fish license(~~((,))~~) or two-consecutive-day
4 personal use food fish license(~~((, salmon license, or sturgeon license))~~)
5 in comparable Oregon waters.

6 If Oregon recognizes as valid the Washington personal use food fish
7 license(~~((,))~~) or two-consecutive-day personal use food fish license(~~((,~~
8 ~~salmon license, or sturgeon license))~~) southward to Cape Falcon in the
9 coastal territorial waters from the Washington-Oregon boundary and in
10 concurrent waters of the Columbia river then Washington shall recognize
11 a valid Oregon license comparable to the Washington personal use food
12 fish license(~~((,))~~) or two-consecutive-day personal use food fish
13 license(~~((, salmon license, or sturgeon license))~~) northward to
14 Leadbetter Point.

15 Oregon licenses are not valid for the taking of food fish when
16 angling in concurrent waters of the Columbia river from the Washington
17 shore.

18 **Sec. 8.** RCW 75.25.140 and 1989 c 305 s 12 are each amended to read
19 as follows:

20 (1) Recreational licenses are not transferable. Upon request of a
21 fisheries patrol officer, ex officio fisheries patrol officer, or
22 authorized fisheries employee, a person digging for, fishing for, or
23 possessing (~~((razor clams))~~) shellfish, seaweed or fishing for or
24 possessing (~~((Hood Canal shrimp or))~~) food fish for personal use shall
25 exhibit the required recreational license and write his or her
26 signature for comparison with the signature on the license. Failure to
27 comply with the request is prima facie evidence that the person does
28 not have a license or is not the person named on the license.

29 (2) The (~~((razor clam))~~) personal use shellfish and seaweed license
30 shall be visible on the licensee while (~~((digging for razor clams))~~)
31 harvesting shellfish or seaweed.

32 **Sec. 9.** RCW 75.25.150 and 1989 c 305 s 13 are each amended to read
33 as follows:

34 It is unlawful to dig for, fish for, or possess (~~((razor clams, fish~~
35 ~~for))~~) shellfish or (~~((possess))~~) food fish(~~((, or take or possess Hood~~
36 ~~Canal shrimp))~~) without the licenses required by this chapter.

1 **Sec. 10.** RCW 75.25.180 and 1989 c 305 s 14 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 Recreational licenses issued by the department of fisheries under
4 this chapter are valid for the following periods:

5 (1) Recreational licenses issued without charge to persons
6 designated by this chapter are valid for a period of five years:

7 (a) For ~~((life for))~~ blind persons;

8 (b) For the period of continued state residency for qualified
9 disabled veterans;

10 (c) ~~((For the period of continued state residency for persons
11 sixty five years of age or more;~~

12 ~~(d))~~ For ~~((the period of the disability for))~~ persons with a
13 developmental disability; and

14 ~~((e))~~ (d) For ~~((life for))~~ handicapped persons confined to a
15 wheelchair who have been issued a permanent disability card~~((; and
16 (f) Until a child reaches fifteen years of age))~~.

17 (2) Two-consecutive-day personal use food fish and shellfish
18 licenses expire at midnight on the day following the validation date
19 written on the license by the license dealer, except two-consecutive-
20 day personal use food fish and shellfish licenses validated for
21 December 31 expire at midnight on that date.

22 (3) ~~((An annual salmon))~~ A personal use food fish license is valid
23 for a maximum catch of fifteen salmon, after which another ~~((salmon))~~
24 personal use food fish license may be purchased. A ~~((salmon))~~ personal
25 use food fish license is valid only for the calendar year for which it
26 is issued.

27 (4) ~~((An annual sturgeon))~~ A personal use food fish license is
28 valid for ~~((a))~~ an annual maximum catch of fifteen sturgeon. ~~((A
29 sturgeon license is valid only for the calendar year for which it is
30 issued.))~~

31 (5) ~~((All other recreational))~~ Personal use shellfish licenses are
32 valid for the calendar year for which they are issued.

33 **Sec. 11.** RCW 75.50.100 and 1990 c 58 s 3 are each amended to read
34 as follows:

35 The dedicated regional fisheries enhancement group account is
36 created in the custody of the state treasurer. Only the director or
37 the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the account.

1 The account is subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW,
2 but no appropriation is required for expenditures.

3 A surcharge of one dollar shall be collected on each recreational
4 (~~salmon~~) personal use food fish license sold in the state. A
5 surcharge of one hundred dollars shall be collected on each commercial
6 salmon fishing license and each charter boat "salmon and other food
7 fish" license sold in the state. The department shall study methods
8 for collecting and making available, an annual list, including names
9 and addresses, of all persons who obtain recreational and commercial
10 salmon fishing licenses. This list may be used to assist formation of
11 the regional fisheries enhancement groups and allow the broadest
12 participation of license holders in enhancement efforts. The results
13 of the study shall be reported to the house of representatives
14 fisheries and wildlife committee and the senate environment and natural
15 resources committee by October 1, 1990. All receipts shall be placed
16 in the regional fisheries enhancement group account and shall be used
17 exclusively for regional fisheries enhancement group projects for the
18 purposes of RCW 75.50.110. Funds from the regional fisheries
19 enhancement group account shall not serve as replacement funding for
20 department operated salmon projects that exist on January 1, 1991.

21 All revenue from the department's sale of salmon carcasses and eggs
22 that return to group facilities shall be deposited in the regional
23 fisheries enhancement group account for use by the regional fisheries
24 enhancement group that produced the surplus. The department shall
25 adopt rules to implement this section pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW.

26 **Sec. 12.** RCW 82.27.020 and 1985 c 413 s 2 are each amended to read
27 as follows:

28 (1) In addition to all other taxes, licenses, or fees provided by
29 law there is established an excise tax on the commercial possession of
30 enhanced food fish as provided in this chapter. The tax is levied upon
31 and shall be collected from the owner of the enhanced food fish whose
32 possession constitutes the taxable event. The taxable event is the
33 first possession in Washington by an owner. Processing and handling of
34 enhanced food fish by a person who is not the owner is not a taxable
35 event to the processor or handler.

36 (2) A person in possession of enhanced food fish and liable to this
37 tax may deduct from the price paid to the person from which the

1 enhanced food fish (except oysters) are purchased an amount equal to a
2 tax at one-half the rate levied in this section upon these products.

3 (3) The measure of the tax is the value of the enhanced food fish
4 at the point of landing.

5 (4) The tax shall be equal to the measure of the tax multiplied by
6 the rates for enhanced food fish as follows:

7 (a) Chinook, coho, and chum salmon and anadromous game fish: Five
8 and twenty-five one-hundredths percent.

9 (b) Pink and sockeye salmon: Three and fifteen one-hundredths
10 percent.

11 (c) Other food fish and shellfish, except oysters: Two and one-
12 tenth percent.

13 (d) Oysters: ((Seven)) Eight one-hundredths of one percent.

14 (5) An additional tax is imposed equal to the rate specified in RCW
15 82.02.030 multiplied by the tax payable under subsection (4) of this
16 section.

17 **Sec. 13.** RCW 75.28.035 and 1989 c 316 s 1 are each amended to read
18 as follows:

19 An application for issuance or renewal of a commercial fishing
20 license shall contain the name and address of the vessel owner, the
21 name and address of the vessel operator, the name and number of the
22 vessel, a description of the vessel and fishing gear to be carried on
23 the vessel, and other information required by the department.

24 At the time of issuance of a commercial fishing license the
25 director shall furnish the licensee with a vessel registration and two
26 license decals.

27 Vessel registrations and license decals issued by the director
28 shall be displayed as provided by rule of the director.

29 A commercial fishing license is not valid if the vessel is operated
30 by a person other than the operator listed on the license. The
31 director may authorize additional operators for the license. ((Unless
32 adjusted by the director pursuant to the director's authority granted
33 in RCW 75.28.065,)) The fee for an additional operator is ((twenty))
34 thirty-five dollars.

35 The vessel owner shall notify the director on forms provided by the
36 department of changes of ownership or ((operator)) vessel and a new
37 license shall be issued upon payment of a fee ((of twenty dollars)):

1 (1) For a change in vessel with no change in ownership, the fee
2 shall be thirty-five dollars;

3 (2) For a change in ownership:

4 (a) The fee shall be equal to three and one-half times the annual
5 renewal fee for the particular license if the license is limited under
6 chapter 75.30 RCW; and

7 (b) The fee shall be equal to the annual renewal fee for the
8 particular license if the license is not limited under chapter 75.30
9 RCW.

10 A defaced, mutilated, or lost license or license decal shall be
11 replaced immediately. (~~Unless adjusted by the director pursuant to~~
12 ~~the director's authority granted in RCW 75.28.065,~~) The replacement
13 fee is (~~ten~~) twenty dollars.

14 As used in this section, "change in ownership" has its ordinary
15 meaning and includes transfers to corporations, partnerships, or other
16 entities, and transfers by the current owner to the current owner and
17 others jointly in joint tenancy, as tenants in common, or otherwise.

18 **Sec. 14.** RCW 75.28.095 and 1989 c 316 s 2, 1989 c 147 s 1, and
19 1989 c 47 s 2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

20 (1) A charter boat license is required for a vessel to be operated
21 as a charter boat from which food fish are taken for personal use.
22 (~~Unless adjusted by the director pursuant to the director's authority~~
23 ~~granted in RCW 75.28.065,~~) The annual license fees are:

30 The license fees in this subsection include the regional
31 enhancement fee required for salmon licenses under RCW 75.50.100.

32 (2) "Charter boat" means a vessel from which persons may, for a
33 fee, fish for food fish, and which delivers food fish into state ports
34 or delivers food fish taken from state waters into United States ports.
35 "Charter boat" does not mean:

1 (a) Vessels not generally engaged in charter boat fishing which are
2 under private lease or charter and operated by the lessee for the
3 lessee's personal recreational enjoyment; or

4 (b) Vessels used by guides for clients fishing for food fish for
5 personal use in freshwater rivers, streams, and lakes, other than Lake
6 Washington or that part of the Columbia River below the bridge at
7 Longview.

8 (3) A charter boat licensed in Oregon shall be permitted to fish
9 without a charter boat license in ocean waters within the jurisdiction
10 of Washington state from the southern border of the state of Washington
11 to Leadbetter Point under the same regulations as Washington charter
12 boat operators, as long as the Oregon vessel does not land at any
13 Washington port with the purpose of taking on or discharging
14 passengers. The provisions of this subsection shall be in effect as
15 long as the state of Oregon has reciprocal laws and regulations.

16 (4) A vessel shall not engage in both charter or sports fishing and
17 commercial fishing on the same day.

18 **Sec. 15.** RCW 75.28.110 and 1989 c 316 s 3 are each amended to read

33 (2) Holders of commercial salmon fishing licenses may retain
34 incidentally caught food fish other than salmon, subject to rules of
35 the director.

36 (3) A salmon troll license allows fishing in all licensing
37 districts and includes a salmon delivery license.

1 (4) A separate gill net license is required to fish for salmon in
2 each of the licensing districts established in RCW 75.28.012.

3 **Sec. 16.** RCW 75.28.113 and 1989 c 316 s 4 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 (1) A person operating a commercial fishing vessel used in taking
6 salmon in offshore waters and delivering the salmon to a place or port
7 in the state shall obtain a salmon delivery license from the director.
8 (~~Unless adjusted by the director pursuant to the director's authority~~
9 ~~granted in RCW 75.28.065,~~) The annual fee for a salmon delivery
10 license is ((two hundred seventy-five)) four hundred eighty dollars for
