- 3 (2) The term "resident student" shall mean: (a) A financially 4 independent student who has had a domicile in the state of Washington for the period of one year immediately prior to the time of 5 commencement of the first day of the semester or quarter for which the 6 7 student has registered at any institution and has in fact established 8 a bona fide domicile in this state primarily for purposes other than 9 educational; (b) a dependent student, if one or both of the student's 10 parents or legal quardians have maintained a bona fide domicile in the state of Washington for at least one year immediately prior to 11 commencement of the semester or quarter for which the student has 12 registered at any institution; (c) a student classified as a resident 13 14 based upon domicile by an institution on or before May 31, 1982, who 15 was enrolled at a state institution during any term of the 1982-1983 academic year, so long as such student's enrollment (excepting summer 16 17 sessions) at an institution in this state is continuous; ((or)) (d) any student who has spent at least seventy-five percent of both his or her 18 19 junior and senior years in high schools in this state, whose parents or legal guardians have been domiciled in the state for a period of at 20 least one year within the five-year period before the student graduates 21 from high school, and who enrolls in a public institution of higher 22 education within six months of leaving high school, for as long as the 23 student remains continuously enrolled for three quarters or two 24 semesters in any calendar year; or (e) a student who is the spouse or 25 26 a dependent of a person who is on active military duty stationed in the state: PROVIDED, That a nonresident student enrolled for more than six 27 hours per semester or quarter shall be considered as attending for 28 29 primarily educational purposes, and for tuition and fee paying purposes 30 only such period of enrollment shall not be counted toward the establishment of a bona fide domicile of one year in this state unless 31 such student proves that the student has in fact established a bona 32 33 fide domicile in this state primarily for purposes other than 34 educational.
- 35 (3) The term "nonresident student" shall mean any student who does 36 not qualify as a "resident student" under the provisions of RCW 37 28B.15.011 through 28B.15.014 and 28B.15.015, each as now or hereafter 38 amended. A nonresident student shall include:

- 1 (a) A student attending an institution with the aid of financial 2 assistance provided by another state or governmental unit or agency 3 thereof, such nonresidency continuing for one year after the completion 4 of such semester or quarter.
- (b) A person who is not a citizen of the United States of America 5 who does not have permanent or temporary resident status or does not 6 7 hold "Refugee-Parolee" or "Conditional Entrant" status with the United States immigration and naturalization service or is not otherwise 8 9 permanently residing in the United States under color of law and who 10 does not also meet and comply with all the applicable requirements in RCW 28B.15.011 through 28B.15.014 and 28B.15.015, each as now or 11 hereafter amended. 12
 - (4) The term "domicile" shall denote a person's true, fixed and permanent home and place of habitation. It is the place where the student intends to remain, and to which the student expects to return when the student leaves without intending to establish a new domicile elsewhere. The burden of proof that a student, parent or guardian has established a domicile in the state of Washington primarily for purposes other than educational lies with the student.

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- (5) The term "dependent" shall mean a person who is not financially independent. Factors to be considered in determining whether a person is financially independent shall be set forth in rules and regulations adopted by the higher education coordinating board and shall include, but not be limited to, the state and federal income tax returns of the person and/or the student's parents or legal guardian filed for the calendar year prior to the year in which application is made and such other evidence as the board may require.
