 - (1) The director may adopt fees to be charged by the department for emblems issued by the department under RCW 46.16.319 ((and 46.16.323)).
- 7 (2) The fee for each remembrance emblem issued under RCW 46.16.319 8 shall be in an amount sufficient to offset the costs of production of remembrance emblems and the administration of that program by the 9 department plus an amount for use by the department of veterans 10 affairs, not to exceed a total fee of twenty-five dollars per emblem. 11 ((The fee for each special vehicle license plate emblem issued under 12 13 RCW 46.16.323 shall be an amount sufficient to offset the cost of 14 production of the emblems and of administering the special vehicle

The fund is subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for expenditures.
- ((4) The special vehicle license plate emblem account is established in the state treasury. Fees collected by the department for emblems issued under RCW 46.16.323 shall be deposited into the special vehicle license plate emblem account to be used only to offset the costs of administering the special vehicle license plate emblem program.))

- Sec. 6. RCW 46.16.381 and 1993 c 106 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The director shall grant special parking privileges to any 4 person who has a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk 5 and meets one of the following criteria, as determined by a licensed 6 physician:
 - (a) Cannot walk two hundred feet without stopping to rest;
- 8 (b) Is severely limited in ability to walk due to arthritic, 9 neurological, or orthopedic condition;
- 10 (c) Is so severely disabled, that the person cannot walk without
 11 the use of or assistance from a brace, cane, another person, prosthetic
 12 device, wheelchair, or other assistive device;
 - (d) Uses portable oxygen;

- (e) Is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that forced expiratory respiratory volume, when measured by spirometry is less than one liter per second or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest;
- (f) Impairment by cardiovascular disease or cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified as class III or IV under standards accepted by the American Heart Association; or
 - (g) Has a disability resulting from an acute sensitivity to automobile emissions which limits or impairs the ability to walk. The personal physician of the applicant shall document that the disability is comparable in severity to the others listed in this subsection.
- 26 (2) Persons who qualify for special parking privileges are entitled 27 to receive from the department of licensing a removable windshield placard bearing the international symbol of access. The department 28 shall design the placard to be displayed when the vehicle is parked by 29 30 suspending it from the rearview mirror, or in the absence of a rearview mirror the card may be displayed on the dashboard of any vehicle used 31 to transport the disabled person. Instead of regular motor vehicle 32 license plates, disabled persons are entitled to receive special 33 license plates bearing the international symbol of access for one 34 35 vehicle registered in the disabled person's name. Disabled persons who are not issued the special license plates are entitled to receive a 36 37 second special placard. Persons who have been issued the parking privileges and who are using a vehicle or are riding in a vehicle 38 39 displaying the special license plates or placard may park in places

reserved for mobility disabled persons. The director shall adopt rules 1 2 providing for the issuance of special placards and license plates to public transportation authorities, nursing homes licensed under chapter 3 4 18.51 RCW, boarding homes licensed under chapter 18.20 RCW, senior 5 citizen centers, ((and)) private nonprofit agencies as defined in chapter 24.03 RCW, and vehicles registered with the department as 6 7 <u>cabulances</u> that regularly transport disabled persons who have been 8 determined eligible for special parking privileges provided under this 9 section. The director may issue special license plates for a vehicle 10 registered in the name of the public transportation authority, nursing home, boarding homes, senior citizen center, ((or)) private nonprofit 11 agency, or cabulance service if the vehicle is primarily used to 12 transport persons with disabilities described in this section. Public 13 transportation authorities, nursing homes, boarding homes, 14 15 citizen centers, ((and)) private nonprofit agencies, and cabulance 16 services are responsible for insuring that the special placards and 17 license plates are not used improperly and are responsible for all fines and penalties for improper use. 18

(3) Whenever the disabled person transfers or assigns his or her interest in the vehicle, the special license plates shall be removed from the motor vehicle. If another vehicle is acquired by the disabled person and the vehicle owner qualifies for a special plate, the plate shall be attached to the vehicle, and the director shall be immediately notified of the transfer of the plate. If another vehicle is not acquired by the disabled person, the removed plate shall be immediately surrendered to the director.

27 (4) The special license plate shall be renewed in the same manner and at the time required for the renewal of regular motor vehicle 28 29 license plates under this chapter. No special license plate may be 30 issued to a person who is temporarily disabled. A person who has a 31 condition expected to improve within six months may be issued a temporary placard for a period not to exceed six months. 32 The director 33 may issue a second temporary placard during that period if requested by the person who is temporarily disabled. If the condition exists after 34 35 six months a new temporary placard shall be issued upon receipt of a new certification from the disabled person's physician. The parking 36 37 placard of a disabled person shall be renewed, when required by the director, by satisfactory proof of the right to continued use of the 38 39 privileges.

- 1 (5) Additional fees shall not be charged for the issuance of the 2 special placards. - 8 (7) It is a traffic infraction, with a monetary penalty of fifty 9 dollars for any person to park a vehicle in a parking place provided on 10 private property without charge or on public property reserved for physically disabled persons without a special license plate or placard. 11 If a person is charged with a violation, the person shall not be 12 determined to have committed an infraction if the person produces in 13 14 court or before the court appearance the special license plate or 15 placard required under this section. A local jurisdiction providing 16 on-street parking places reserved for physically disabled persons may 17 impose by ordinance time restrictions on the use of these parking places. 18
- 19 (8) The portion of a penalty imposed under subsection (7) of this 20 section that is retained by a local jurisdiction under RCW 3.46.120, 3.50.100, 3.62.020, 3.62.040, or 35.20.220 shall be used by that local jurisdiction exclusively for law enforcement. The court may also impose an additional penalty sufficient to reimburse the local jurisdiction for any costs it may have incurred in removal and storage of the improperly parked vehicle.
- 26 (9) It is a misdemeanor for any person to willfully obtain a 27 special license plate or placard in a manner other than that 28 established under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW to read as follows:
- A collegiate license plate fund is established in the custody of the state treasurer for each college or university with a collegiate license plate program approved by the department under section 3 of this act. All receipts from collegiate license plates authorized under RCW 46.16.301 shall be deposited in the appropriate local college or university nonappropriated, nonallotted fund. Expenditures from the funds may be used only for student scholarships. Only the president of

- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** By January 1, 1996, the department of
