## **HB 1024**

As Passed Legislature

**Title:** An act relating to general obligation bonds issued by a fire protection district.

Brief Description: Extending the maturity date for general obligation bonds issued by fire protection districts.

**Sponsors:** Representatives Rayburn, Edmondson, Bray and Dunshee.

## Brief History:

Reported by House Committee on: Local Government, January 22, 1993, DP; Passed House, February 3, 1993, 96-0; Amended by Senate; Passed Legislature, April 19, 1993, 96-0.

**Background:** Statutes that establish debt limitations for different taxing districts also establish the maximum term of the debt or bonds. The most common maximum term for both voter approved and non-voter approved general indebtedness is 40 years.

Fire protection districts are authorized to incur both non-voter approved general indebtedness and an overall amount of both voter approved and non-voter approved indebtedness. The maximum term of non-voter approved general indebtedness that a fire protection district may incur is six years. The maximum term of voter approved general indebtedness that a fire protection district may incur is 20 years.

**Summary of Bill:** The maximum term of non-voter approved general indebtedness that a fire protection district may incur is increased from six years to 20 years.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** This modernizes fire district statutes. Fire trucks have a life expectancy far in excess of 15 years.

Testimony Against: None.
