## HOUSE COMMITTEE ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT

**Majority Report:** Do pass. Signed by 8 members: Representatives H. Myers, Chair; Bray, Vice Chair; Edmondson, Ranking Minority Member; Reams, Assistant Ranking Minority Member; Horn; Rayburn; Van Luven; and Zellinsky.

**Minority Report:** Do not pass. Signed by 4 members: Representatives Dunshee; R. Fisher; Romero; and Springer.

**Staff:** Steve Lundin (786-7127).

**Background:** Public hospital districts are authorized to provide a variety of health related facilities and services.

**Summary of Bill:** Public hospital districts are authorized to employ chaplains for their hospitals, health care facilities, and hospice programs.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** January 1, 1994, if a related constitutional amendment is approved by the voters.

**Testimony For:** The auditor indicates that the constitution precludes hospital districts from employing chaplains. Chaplains can play an essential role in both the healing process and dying.

Testimony Against: None.
