# **BACKGROUND:**

The property of nonprofit charitable organizations is generally exempt from property tax if the property is used for a charitable purpose. Some of the exempt nonprofit organizations provide character-building, benevolent, protective and rehabilitative social services. However, nonprofit organizations that raise money for nonprofit charitable organizations are not exempt from property tax.

# **SUMMARY:**

The property owned by nonprofit organizations which is used to solicit gifts, donations, or grants is exempt from property tax. To qualify for the exemption the organization must:

- 1. Be organized for nonsectarian purposes;
- 2. Be affiliated with a state or national organization;
- 3. Be exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the federal Internal Revenue Code;
- 4. Be governed by a volunteer board of directors; and
- 5. Use the gifts, donations, and grants for character-building, benevolent, protective, or rehabilitative social services for persons of all ages or distribute the gifts, donations, or grants to at least five other

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nonprofit nonsectarian organizations that provide character-building, benevolent, protective, or rehabilitative social services for persons of all ages.
