- 1 AN ACT Relating to parenting seminars; and adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 26.12 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 26.12 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) Family law judges and court commissioners shall order parents
 7 who have minor children and who have filed for divorce to attend
 8 parenting seminars concerning the short-term and long-term impacts of
 9 divorce upon children. The parents must satisfactorily complete the
 10 parenting seminar before the court may grant the divorce.
- 11 (2) Judges and court commissioners shall also order parents who have minor children and who have obtained a divorce and are seeking a 12 13 modification of the parenting plan or custody or visitation order to 14 attend parenting seminars as provided in subsection (1) of this 15 section, if the parents did not attend a parenting seminar when the parents were divorced. Judges and court commissioners may require the 16 17 parents to attend the parenting seminar prior to obtaining a modification. 18

- 1 (3) Judges and court commissioners shall also order unmarried 2 parents of minor children to attend parenting seminars when the parents 3 are involved in a paternity action or other action in which the court 4 establishes or modifies the respective parents rights of custody or 5 visitation or establishes a parenting plan.
- 6 (4) The parents shall pay for the cost of the parenting seminar 7 unless the county legislative authority authorizes funding for 8 parenting seminars or the parents are able to obtain funding through 9 alternative sources or fee waivers.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 26.12 RCW to read as follows:
- 12 The supreme court shall adopt rules to implement section 1 of this 13 act.
