1 AN ACT Relating to additional tuition fees at institutions of
2 higher education; and reenacting and amending RCW 28B.15.202 and
3 28B.15.402.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.202 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 8 and 1993 c 379 s
6 202 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

7 Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at the
8 University of Washington and at Washington State University for other
9 than the summer term shall be as follows:

10 (1)(a) For full time resident undergraduate students and all other
11 full time resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled
12 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
13 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition
14 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be thirty-six and three-tenths
15 percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be forty-one and one-
16 tenth percent of the per student undergraduate educational costs at the
17 state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
18 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
19 shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96

1 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
2 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
3 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
4 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
5 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

6 (b) Full time resident undergraduate students who have accumulated
7 more than one hundred fifteen percent of the maximum number of credit
8 hours required for their respective degree programs shall pay
9 additional tuition fees equal to twenty percent of the total tuition
10 fees specified in (a) of this subsection. Revenue from these
11 additional fees shall be distributed between the respective
12 institution's local operating fee account and its state building fee
13 account in the same proportion as revenue from students below the
14 credit levels requiring the additional fees.

15 (2) For full time resident graduate and law students not enrolled
16 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of
17 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition
18 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and two-tenths
19 percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-eight and
20 four-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at
21 the state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
22 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
23 shall be one hundred and twenty dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96
24 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
25 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
26 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
27 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
28 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

29 (3) For full time resident students enrolled in programs leading to
30 the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor
31 of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one hundred
32 sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (2) of this
33 section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year shall
34 be three hundred and forty-two dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96
35 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
36 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
37 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
38 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
39 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

1 (4)(a) For full time nonresident undergraduate students and such
2 other full time nonresident students not in graduate study programs or
3 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,
4 doctor of dental surgery, or doctor of veterinary medicine, the total
5 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be one hundred nine
6 and three-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be one
7 hundred twenty-two and nine-tenths percent of the per student
8 undergraduate educational costs at the state universities computed as
9 provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building
10 fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and fifty-four
11 dollars. Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for
12 each academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This
13 percentage shall be calculated by the higher education coordinating
14 board and be based on the actual percentage the building fee is of
15 total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest
16 half percent.

17 (b) Full time nonresident undergraduate students who have
18 accumulated more than one hundred fifteen percent of the maximum number
19 of credit hours required for their respective degree programs shall pay
20 additional tuition fees equal to twenty percent of the total tuition
21 fees specified in (a) of this subsection. Revenue from these
22 additional fees shall be distributed between the respective
23 institution's local operating fee account and its state building fee
24 account in the same proportion as revenue from students below the
25 credit levels requiring the additional fees.

26 (5) For full time nonresident graduate and law students not
27 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,
28 doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the total
29 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be sixty-five and six-
30 tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be seventy-three
31 and six-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at
32 the state universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
33 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
34 shall be three hundred and fifty-four dollars. Beginning with the
35 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be
36 a percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be
37 calculated by the higher education coordinating board and be based on
38 the actual percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-
39 95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

1 (6) For full time nonresident students enrolled in programs leading
2 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and
3 doctor of veterinary medicine, the total tuition fees shall be one
4 hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in subsection (5) of
5 this section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
6 shall be five hundred and fifty-five dollars. Beginning with the 1995-
7 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
8 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
9 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
10 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
11 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

12 (7) The governing boards of the state universities shall charge to
13 and collect from each student, a services and activities fee. The
14 governing board may increase the existing fee annually, consistent with
15 budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not
16 to exceed the annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate
17 tuition fees: PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply
18 to that portion of the services and activities fee previously committed
19 to the repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic year,
20 services and activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-three
21 dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic year, services and
22 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred forty-nine dollars per
23 student. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW
24 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee
25 increase.

26 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.402 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 11 and 1993 c 379 s
27 203 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

28 Tuition fees and maximum services and activities fees at the
29 regional universities and The Evergreen State College for other than
30 the summer term shall be as follows:

31 (1)(a) For full time resident undergraduate students and all other
32 full time resident students not in graduate study programs, the total
33 tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-seven and
34 seven-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be thirty-
35 one and five-tenths percent of the per student undergraduate
36 educational costs at the regional universities computed as provided in
37 RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for
38 each academic year shall be seventy-six dollars and fifty cents.

1 Beginning with the 1995-96 academic year the building fee for each
2 academic year shall be a percentage of total tuition fees. This
3 percentage shall be calculated by the higher education coordinating
4 board and be based on the actual percentage the building fee is of
5 total tuition in the 1994-95 academic year, rounded up to the nearest
6 half percent.

7 (b) Full time resident undergraduate students who have accumulated
8 more than one hundred fifteen percent of the maximum number of credit
9 hours required for their respective degree programs shall pay
10 additional tuition fees equal to twenty percent of the total tuition
11 fees specified in (a) of this subsection. Revenue from these
12 additional fees shall be distributed between the respective
13 institution's local operating fee account and its state building fee
14 account in the same proportion as revenue from students below the
15 credit levels requiring the additional fees.

16 (2) For full time resident graduate students, the total tuition
17 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be twenty-five and three-
18 tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees shall be twenty-eight
19 and six-tenths percent of the per student graduate educational costs at
20 the regional universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and
21 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year
22 shall be seventy-six dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-
23 96 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
24 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
25 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
26 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
27 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

28 (3)(a) For full time nonresident undergraduate students and all
29 other full time nonresident students not in graduate study programs,
30 the total tuition fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be one
31 hundred nine and four-tenths percent and thereafter total tuition fees
32 shall be one hundred twenty-three percent of the per student
33 undergraduate educational costs at the regional universities computed
34 as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the
35 building fees for each academic year shall be two hundred and
36 ninety-five dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-96
37 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
38 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
39 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual

1 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
2 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

3 (b) Full time nonresident undergraduate students who have
4 accumulated more than one hundred fifteen percent of the maximum number
5 of credit hours required for their respective degree programs shall pay
6 additional tuition fees equal to twenty percent of the total tuition
7 fees specified in (a) of this subsection. Revenue from these
8 additional fees shall be distributed between the respective
9 institution's local operating fee account and its state building fee
10 account in the same proportion as revenue from students below the
11 credit levels requiring the additional fees.

12 (4) For full time nonresident graduate students, the total tuition
13 fees for the 1993-94 academic year shall be eighty-two percent and
14 thereafter total tuition fees shall be ninety-two percent of the per
15 student graduate educational costs at the regional universities
16 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That
17 the building fees for each academic year shall be two hundred and
18 ninety-five dollars and fifty cents. Beginning with the 1995-96
19 academic year the building fee for each academic year shall be a
20 percentage of total tuition fees. This percentage shall be calculated
21 by the higher education coordinating board and be based on the actual
22 percentage the building fee is of total tuition in the 1994-95 academic
23 year, rounded up to the nearest half percent.

24 (5) The governing boards of each of the regional universities and
25 The Evergreen State College shall charge to and collect from each
26 student, a services and activities fee. The governing board may
27 increase the existing fee annually, consistent with budgeting
28 procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a percentage not to exceed
29 the annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition fees:
30 PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply to that portion
31 of the services and activities fee previously committed to the
32 repayment of bonded debt. For the 1993-94 academic year, services and
33 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred eight-four [eighty-four]
34 dollars per student. For the 1994-95 academic year, services and
35 activities fees shall not exceed two hundred ninety dollars per
36 student. The services and activities fee committee provided for in RCW

1 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing board for a fee
2 increase.
