- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The economy of Washington is heavily dependent on timber
- 9 harvesting and forest products production; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There is a fundamental need to protect old growth forest
- 11 ecosystems through comprehensive forest management on federal lands;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, A severe forest management crisis exists in the Pacific
- 14 Northwest affecting the lives of thousands of timber workers, families,
- 15 and communities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, A solution to the forest management crisis must balance
- 17 economic needs with ecosystem protection; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Economic Recovery Coordination Board support a
- 19 bipartisan Pacific Northwest forest summit proposed by President Bill
- 20 Clinton as the most reasonable solution to the forest management
- 21 crisis; and

- WHEREAS, The Northwest congressional delegation should support a 1 bipartisan Northwest forest summit as a means of resolving the ongoing 2
- 3 forest management crisis; and

- 4 WHEREAS, The summit should be held as soon as possible once the Clinton administration takes office; and 5
- WHEREAS, The summit conferees obtain input from all interested 6 7 parties on the forest management issue and the actual summit decisions 8 should be determined by the conferees consisting of representatives 9 from the new administration, the Northwest congressional delegation,
- 10 and the governors of the affected states only; and
- WHEREAS, The outcome of the summit should result in an outline for 11 legislation that will: 12
 - (1) Maintain and diversify the economy of timber communities;
- 14 (2) Assure continuation of essential local government services and 15 community stability;
- (3) Provide a stable and predictable supply of timber and a 16 reasonable level of jobs in the forest industry; and 17
- (4) Provide protection for fragile forest 18 ecosystems and 19 biodiversity;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the 20 Northwest congressional delegation and other interested members of 21 congress should refrain from introducing legislation concerning federal 22 23 forest management pending the outcome of the summit. The summit should 24 serve to develop legislation.
- 25 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 26 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 27 28 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of 29 Washington.
