- TO HIS EXCELLENCY FIDEL RAMOS, PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES:
- We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 4 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 5 represent and petition as follows:
- 6 WHEREAS, There exists a long history of warm relations between the
- 7 people of Washington and the Philippines, of personal friendships, and
- 8 family ties; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Washington is greatly honored that the Philippines chose
- 10 to open a Consulate in our state; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Pacific Northwest and the Philippines are neighbors in
- 12 the Pacific Rim with a shared economic future; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Philippine Consulate has played a critical role in
- 14 trade between the Philippines and Washington State; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Philippines conducted over two hundred twenty-five
- 16 million dollars worth of waterborne trade with the Port of Seattle in
- 17 1991; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Philippines are a major buyer of Washington wheat and
- 19 other agricultural products; and

WHEREAS, Exports from the Philippines to Washington State reached almost five million dollars in 1991, representing a nearly three hundred million dollar trade surplus in favor of the Philippines; and WHEREAS, The estimated sixty-five thousand Washington State residents of Philippine descent are closely linked to the Consulate and raised over thirty-seven thousand dollars for the victims of the Mt. Pinatubo volcanic eruption; and

8 WHEREAS, The Filipino community in Washington State is growing at 9 a rate in excess of one thousand persons per year; and

10 WHEREAS, We look forward to the months and years ahead as the 11 people of the Philippines and Washington continue to build a firm 12 foundation of business and personal ties to create a better future for 13 our children;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Philippine government allow its Seattle Consulate to remain open, and consider downsizing staff and office space to cut costs instead of closing the Consulate.

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to His Excellency Fidel Ramos, President of the Republic of the Philippines.
