- 13 provide consistency and accountability through federal requirements on
- 14 the use of federal funds and the constraint it places on local
- 15 creativity and innovation; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Greater flexibility in administering federal programs can
- 17 result in a reduction of costs of the programs, and a more efficient
- 18 use of federal funds; and
- 19 WHEREAS, A relaxation and loosening of certain restrictive federal
- 20 regulations can result in positive progress in solving public policy
- 21 issues on such diverse topics as the federal budget deficit and the
