- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States is currently involved in efforts to
- 9 rewrite international trade rules under the auspices of the General
- 10 Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and the North American Free Trade
- 11 Agreement; and
- 12 WHEREAS, International trade agreements can provide benefit to the
- 13 people of the United States and Washington state, if those agreements
- 14 are properly structured and then negotiated; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mexico and less industrialized countries, that comprise
- 16 over half the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade negotiating
- 17 nations, have significantly different standards of living than the
- 18 United States, often having three dollar per day wages or less, limited
- 19 educational opportunities, unprotected child labor, no worker rights,
- 20 reckless use of pesticides and chemicals long since outlawed in the
- 21 United States, highly toxic substances routinely dumped into rivers,

- 1 undrinkable waters, and little sanitation or adequate sewer systems;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, These discrepancies lend to dramatic differences in the
- 4 cost of doing business and leave the United States at a competitive
- 5 disadvantage; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Agriculture and industry in the United States and
- 7 Washington state are competitive in the world economy on a fair and
- 8 level playing field but the current General Agreement on Tariffs and
- 9 Trade and North American Free Trade Agreement proposals move us in the
- 10 wrong direction; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Current procedures strip the United States Congress of
- 12 authority to amend or modify final General Agreement on Tariffs and
- 13 Trade and North American Free Trade Agreement agreements, leaving
- 14 Congress with only a "yes" or "no" fast-track vote;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 16 Congressional Delegation of the State of Washington and all members of
- 17 Congress inform the President and the Office of the United States Trade
- 18 Representative that they will not approve any legislation to implement
- 19 a trade agreement that: (1) Jeopardizes the existing United States
- 20 standard of living, the labor, health, safety, or environmental laws,
- 21 regulations, and other standards; and the workplace and civil
- 22 protection of all United States citizens; or (2) limits the ability of
- 23 Congress or local and state governments to adopt laws to protect the
- 24 health and safety of their people, their working conditions, domestic
- 25 food supplies, and the environment.
- 26 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 27 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United
- 28 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 29 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 30 Washington.
