- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED AND TO SECRETARY OF ENERGY HAZEL
- 5 O'LEARY:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, Congress created the Bonneville Power Administration to
- 10 revitalize the stagnant Pacific Northwest economy with inexpensive
- 11 hydropower from the Bonneville Dam and other dams on the Columbia River
- 12 system; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Pacific Northwest electric marketplace is changing due
- 14 to the deregulation of the electric utility industry, the end of the
- 15 Northwest energy surplus, increased competition in power markets, new
- 16 and growing environmental commitments, and new investment needs; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration has initiated its
- 18 Competitiveness Project through which it will reorganize itself in
- 19 order to maintain its low-cost supplier position by increasing its
- 20 efficiency and becoming an institution that is market-driven, customer-
- 21 focused, cost-conscious, and results-oriented; and

- WHEREAS, Vice President Gore's National Performance Review Task Force has designated the Bonneville Power Administration one of seventeen "Reinvention Laboratories" in the federal government that will become more efficient, more responsive, and in some cases, a smaller government agency that cuts through red tape, exceeds customer expectations, and unleashes innovations for improvement from its employees; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration is supported by the 9 revenues it receives by selling electric power, transmission services, 10 and other products primarily in the Pacific Northwest; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration provides sixty-five 12 percent of the electric power consumed in the state of Washington; and 13 WHEREAS, The Washington State Energy Strategy states, "energy is 14 one of the key factors that defines the economic opportunities, 15 environment, and quality of life in the state of Washington"; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The National Academy of Public Administration has 17 completed a report that concludes that Bonneville Power administration 18 fits all the criteria for a government corporation; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Corporation status would save ratepayers tens of millions 20 of dollars every year in administrative costs and retain the Bonneville 21 Power Administration's relationships with Congress, the Northwest Power 22 Planning Council, and state and local governments;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the President and Congress support the Bonneville Power Administration's Competitiveness Project that represents the agency's efforts to retain its status as the region's low-cost electricity provider and become a more efficient, as well as, effective competitor in the utility industry; and
- BE IT RESOLVED, That the Clinton Administration work closely with the Bonneville Power Administration through Vice President Gore's National Performance Review to assist Bonneville in becoming more responsive to the needs of the Pacific Northwest; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Congress designate the Bonneville Power Administration as a government corporation that would continue to operate under the terms and conditions of existing federal legislation; and
