Reading of Bills

- 5 **Sec. I.** HR 4608 Rule 10 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Rule 10. Every bill shall be read on three separate days:
- 7 PROVIDED, That this rule may be temporarily suspended at any time by
- 8 a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present; and that on and after
- 9 the fifth day prior to the day of adjournment sine die of any
- 10 session, as determined pursuant to Article II, Section 12 of the
- 11 state Constitution or concurrent resolution, or on and after the
- 12 third day prior to the day a bill must be reported from the house as
- 13 established by concurrent resolution, this rule may be suspended by
- 14 a majority vote.
- 15 (A) FIRST READING. The first reading of a bill shall be by
- 16 title only, unless a majority of the members present demand a reading
- 17 in full.

- 18 After the first reading the bill shall be referred to an
- 19 appropriate committee.
- 20 Upon being reported out of committee, all bills shall be
- 21 referred to the rules committee, unless otherwise ordered by the
- 22 house.
- 23 The rules committee may, by majority vote, refer any bill in its
- 24 possession to a committee for further consideration. Such referral
- 25 shall be reported to the house and entered in the journal under the
- 26 fifth order of business.
- 27 (B) SECOND READING. Upon second reading, the bill number and

- 1 short title and the last line of the bill shall be read unless a
- 2 majority of the members present shall demand its reading in full.
- 3 The bill shall be subject to amendment section by section. No
- 4 amendment shall be considered by the house until it has been sent to
- 5 the chief clerk's desk in writing, distributed to the desk of each
- 6 member and read by the clerk. All amendments adopted during second
- 7 reading shall be securely fastened to the original bill. All
- 8 amendments rejected by the house shall be passed to the minute clerk,
- 9 and the journal shall show the disposition of such amendments.
- When no further amendments shall be offered, the speaker shall
- 11 declare the bill has passed its second reading.
- 12 (C) SUBSTITUTE BILLS. When a committee reports a substitute
- 13 for an original bill with the recommendation that the substitute bill
- 14 do pass, it shall be in order to read the substitute the first time
- 15 and have the same printed. ((A bill for which a substitute has been
- 16 recommended by a standing committee may not be subject to another
- 17 substitute report by a committee that subsequently considers it.
- 18 Amendments to a recommended substitute may be adopted and reported by
- 19 such committee.))
- 20 A motion for the substitution shall not be in order until the
- 21 second reading of the original bill.
- 22 (D) THIRD READING. Only the last line of bills shall be read
- 23 on third reading unless a majority of the members present demand a
- 24 reading in full. No amendments to a bill shall be received on third
- 25 reading but it may be referred or recommitted for the purpose of
- 26 amendment.
- 27 (E) SUSPENSION CALENDAR. Bills may be placed on the second
- 28 reading suspension calendar by the rules committee if at least two
- 29 minority party members of the rules committee join in such motion.
- 30 Bills on the second reading suspension calendar shall not be subject
- 31 to amendment or substitution except as recommended in the committee
- 32 report. When a bill is before the house on the suspension calendar,
- 33 the question shall be to adopt the committee recommendations and

- 1 advance the bill to third reading. If the question fails to receive
- 2 a two-thirds vote of the members present, the bill shall be referred
- 3 to the rules committee for second reading.
- 4 (F) HOUSE RESOLUTIONS. House resolutions shall be filed with 5 the chief clerk who shall transmit them to the rules committee. If
- 6 a rules committee meeting is not scheduled to occur prior to a time
- 7 necessitated by the purpose of a house resolution, the majority
- 8 leader and minority leader by agreement may waive transmission to the
- 9 rules committee to permit consideration of the resolution by the
- 10 house. The rules committee may adopt house resolutions by a sixty
- 11 percent majority vote of its entire membership or may, by a majority
- 12 vote of its members, place them on the motions calendar for
- 13 consideration by the house.

- 14 (G) CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS. Reading of concurrent resolutions
- 15 may be advanced by majority vote.

24	Rule	32. The house of representatives directs the house	
25	executive	rules committee to adopt procedures and guidelines to	
26	ensure tha	at all legislative mailings at public expense are for	

legitimate legislative purposes. With respect to member mailings to

- 1 constituents, these policies and guidelines shall ensure that:
- 2 (A) All mailings are subject to applicable provisions of the 3 code of ethics established in Rules 1 through 9 of the joint rules of 4 the legislature.
- 5 (B) Within the twelve months preceding the expiration of a 6 member's term of office, identical mailings are limited as follows: 7 One mailing mailed within thirty days after the start of the regular 8 legislative session and one mailing mailed within sixty days after the end of the regular legislative session. 9 For purposes of this 10 rule, an identical mailing is a mailing of identical content in 11 excess of two hundred pieces not mailed in response to a constituent 12 contact.
- (C) Within the twelve months preceding the expiration of a member's term of office, individual letters are limited as follows:
 A member may mail to an individual constituent a letter or other information, including the member's opinion, on a matter relevant to legislative business if the member has a reasonable belief that the constituent is interested in that matter.
- 19 (D) The total cost of each member's mailings, including 20 production costs, printing costs, and postage, are limited by an 21 annual expenditure level established by the house executive rules 22 committee.
