- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO SECRETARY MIKE ESPY,
- 5 SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, The State of Washington has since February of 1991,
- 10 operated a Rural Development Council, as a means to identify,
- 11 communicate, and act upon new means of protecting and enhancing the
- 12 viability and self reliance of rural Washington communities; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Voluntary and meaningful communication among all levels of
- 14 government, including tribal governments and the nonprofit and private
- 15 sectors is critical for the representation of the needs and interests
- 16 of rural residents; and
- 17 WHEREAS, It is also of critical importance to the integrity of the
- 18 entire state to identify ways that urban and rural economies of
- 19 Washington can function to complement each other and reinforce the
- 20 quality of life available to residents; and

WHEREAS, The Council is a partnership between state, federal, local government, tribal government, and the nonprofit and private sectors, and is organized to meet the needs of all members of the partnership in a mutual effort to mitigate negative impacts upon rural communities, enhance their viability and self reliance, and look for ways to coordinate, synchronize, or consolidate the efforts of all who serve rural communities and citizens; and

WHEREAS, The objectives of the Council are consistent with the Council's mission and honor the perspectives of the partnership in their mutual undertaking of the following:

11 (1) To provide a forum for policy analysis concerning existing and 12 proposed rural development strategies in Washington;

- 13 (2) To promote coordination and cooperation between all levels of 14 government and private, public, and nonprofit groups in order to 15 promote rural economic vitality;
- 16 (3) To facilitate communication between rural communities and 17 organizations and other sectors of the state and nation;
- (4) To promote the establishment of rural-urban partnerships that will be mutually beneficial to both areas in alleviating the distress of rapid economic growth or decline and promoting economic vitality;
- 21 (5) To identify and address federal, state, and local 22 administrative barriers that hinder economic vitality;
- 23 (6) To identify and provide opportunities to educate and inform 24 state, federal, and local policy and program staff as to the needs and 25 special development context of rural Washington; and
- 26 (7) To identify ways to promote educational opportunities for 27 citizens in rural communities; and
 - WHEREAS, In acknowledgement and recognition of these efforts all agencies and branches of state government that operate programs in rural areas of the state are being encouraged to participate actively in the activities of the Council;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray and openly 32 solicit the continued partnership between federal agencies and the 33 Washington State Rural Development Council, and encourage the continued 34 35 substantive participation and fiscal support by Washington State agencies and branches of state government, so as to further the 36 37 significant accomplishments brought about in our state through the efforts of the leadership and members of the Washington State Rural 38 39 Development Council.
