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5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the  
6 following:

7 "Sec. 1. RCW 41.32.570 and 1994 c 69 s 2 are each amended to read  
8 as follows:

9 (1) Any retired teacher or retired administrator who enters service  
10 in any public educational institution in Washington state shall cease  
11 to receive pension payments while engaged in such service: PROVIDED,  
12 That service may be rendered up to seventy-five days per school year  
13 without reduction of pension.

14 (2) In addition to the seventy-five days of service permitted under  
15 subsection (1) of this section, a retired teacher or retired  
16 administrator may also serve only as a substitute teacher for up to an  
17 additional fifteen days per school year without reduction of pension  
18 if:

19 (a) A school district, which is not a member of a multidistrict  
20 substitute cooperative, determines that it has exhausted or can  
21 reasonably anticipate that it will exhaust its list of qualified and  
22 available substitutes and the school board of the district adopts a  
23 resolution to make its substitute teachers who are retired teachers or  
24 retired administrators eligible for the additional fifteen days of  
25 extended service once the list of qualified and available substitutes  
26 has been exhausted. The resolution by the school district shall state  
27 that the services of retired teachers and retired administrators are  
28 necessary to address the shortage of qualified and available  
29 substitutes. The resolution shall be valid only for the school year in  
30 which it is adopted. The district shall forward a copy of the  
31 resolution with a list of retired teachers and retired administrators  
32 who have been employed as substitute teachers to the department and may  
33 notify the retired teachers and retired administrators included on the  
34 list of their right to take advantage of the provisions of this  
35 subsection; or

36 (b) A multidistrict substitute cooperative determines that the

1 school districts have exhausted or can reasonably anticipate that they  
2 will exhaust their list of qualified and available substitutes and each  
3 of the school boards adopts a resolution to make their substitute  
4 teachers or retired administrators who are retired teachers eligible  
5 for the extended service once the list of qualified and available  
6 substitutes has been exhausted. The resolutions by each of the school  
7 districts shall state that the services of retired teachers and retired  
8 administrators are necessary to address the shortage of qualified and  
9 available substitutes. The resolutions shall be valid only for the  
10 school year in which they are adopted. The cooperative shall forward  
11 a copy of the resolutions with a list of retired teachers and retired  
12 administrators who have been employed as substitute teachers to the  
13 department and may notify the retired teachers and retired  
14 administrators included on the list of their right to take advantage of  
15 the provisions of this subsection.

16 (3) In addition to the seventy-five days of service permitted under  
17 subsection (1) of this section, a retired administrator may also serve  
18 as a substitute administrator up to an additional fifteen days per  
19 school year without reduction of pension if a school district board of  
20 directors adopts a resolution declaring that the services of a retired  
21 administrator or retired teacher are necessary because it cannot find  
22 a replacement administrator to fill a vacancy. The resolution shall be  
23 valid only for the school year in which it is adopted. The district  
24 shall forward a copy of the resolution with the name of the retired  
25 administrator or retired teacher who has been employed as a substitute  
26 administrator to the department. However, a retired administrator may  
27 not serve more than a total of fifteen additional days per school year  
28 pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) of this section.

29 (4) Subsection (1) of this section shall apply to all persons  
30 governed by the provisions of plan I, regardless of the date of their  
31 retirement, but shall apply only to benefits payable after June 11,  
32 1986.

33 (~~(4)~~) (5) Subsection (2) of this section shall apply to all  
34 persons governed by the provisions of plan I, regardless of the date of  
35 their retirement, but shall only apply to benefits payable after  
36 September 1, 1994.

37 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate  
38 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

1 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take  
2 effect immediately."

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6 On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "administrators;" strike the  
7 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 41.32.570; and  
8 declaring an emergency."

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
