6 "Sec. 4. RCW 25.04.720 and 1995 c 337 s 5 are each amended to read
7 as follows:

8 (1) A person or group of persons licensed or otherwise legally
9 authorized to render professional services, as defined in RCW
10 18.100.030, within this state may organize and become a member or
11 members of a limited liability partnership under the provisions of this
12 chapter for the purposes of rendering professional service. Nothing in
13 this section prohibits a person duly licensed or otherwise legally
14 authorized to render professional services in any jurisdiction other
15 than this state from becoming a member of a limited liability
16 partnership organized for the purpose of rendering the same
17 professional services. Nothing in this section prohibits a limited
18 liability partnership from rendering professional services outside this
19 state through individuals who are not duly licensed or otherwise
20 legally authorized to render such professional services within this
21 state.

22 (2)(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, health
23 care professionals who are licensed or certified pursuant to chapters
24 18.06, 18.19, 18.22, 18.25, 18.29, 18.34, 18.35, 18.36A, 18.50, 18.53,
25 18.55, 18.64, 18.79, 18.83, 18.89, 18.108, and 18.138 RCW may join and
26 render their individual professional services through one limited
27 liability partnership and are to be considered, for the purpose of
28 forming a limited liability partnership, as rendering the "same
29 specific professional services" or "same professional services" or
30 similar terms.

31 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, health
32 care professionals who are licensed pursuant to chapters 18.57 and
33 18.71 RCW may join and render their individual professional services
34 through one limited liability partnership and are to be considered, for
35 the purpose of forming a limited liability partnership, as rendering
36 the "same specific professional services" or "same professional
37 services" or similar terms.

1 (c) Formation of a limited liability partnership under this
2 subsection does not restrict the application of the uniform
3 disciplinary act under chapter 18.130 RCW, or any applicable health
4 care professional statutes under Title 18 RCW, including but not
5 limited to restrictions on persons practicing a health profession
6 without being appropriately credentialed and persons practicing beyond
7 the scope of their credential."
