- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Congressional ratification of the North American Free
- 9 Trade Agreement and the General Agreement on Trade and Tariffs
- 10 demonstrates our nation's commitment to eliminating economic barriers
- 11 to an open and competitive trading system; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Promoting free and open trade with Canada and other
- 13 nations is in the best economic interests of all Washington citizens;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, A border crossing fee would run counter to efforts by both
- 16 Canada and the United States to facilitate the movement of people and
- 17 goods across the border; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Collection of the fees would result in increased
- 19 congestion at border entry points and disruption of the smooth flow of
- 20 commercial traffic; and

- WHEREAS, Citizens and businesses of Northwest Washington, North
 Central Washington, and Northeast Washington depend heavily upon
- 3 thriving, reciprocal economic activity with the citizens of Canada; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Imposition of such fees would affect almost one hundred
- 5 million Canadian and American travelers annually; and
- 6 WHEREAS, More than nineteen million people cross the border yearly
- 7 from Canada into Northwest Washington at crossings at Blaine, Sumas,
- 8 Point Roberts, and Lynden; and
- 9 WHEREAS, More than three hundred thousand Canadian citizens visit
- 10 Washington state yearly to spend at least one night and contribute more
- 11 than two hundred fifty million dollars to Washington state's economy;
- 12 and
- WHEREAS, The millions of people entering the United States have a
- 14 direct and positive effect on the livelihoods of American citizens
- 15 living near the Canadian border and on citizens throughout Washington
- 16 state; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The proposed fees for visitors entering the United States
- 18 would result in extreme financial hardship for many citizens and small
- 19 businesses in Washington state;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the 1996
- 21 federal budget proposal to establish a United States border crossing
- 22 fee be modified to eliminate the reference to the proposed United
- 23 States entry fee.
- 24 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 25 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United
- 26 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 27 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 28 Washington.
