1 AN ACT Relating to the authority of the board of physical therapy
2 over supportive personnel; and reenacting and amending RCW 18.74.023.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.74.023 and 1991 c 12 s 3 and 1991 c 3 s 175 are
5 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

6 The board has the following powers and duties:

7 (1) To administer examinations to applicants for a license under
8 this chapter.

9 (2) To pass upon the qualifications of applicants for a license and
10 to certify to the secretary duly qualified applicants.

11 (3) To make such rules not inconsistent with the laws of this state
12 as may be deemed necessary or proper to carry out the purposes of this
13 chapter.

14 (4) To establish and administer requirements for continuing
15 competency, which shall be a prerequisite to renewing a license under
16 this chapter.

17 (5) To keep an official record of all its proceedings, which record
18 shall be evidence of all proceedings of the board which are set forth
19 therein.

1 (6) To adopt rules not inconsistent with the laws of this state,
2 when it deems appropriate, in response to questions put to it by
3 professional health associations, physical therapists, and consumers in
4 this state concerning the authority of physical therapists to perform
5 particular acts.

6 (7) To adopt rules to define and specify the education and training
7 requirements for physical therapist assistants and physical therapy
8 aides.

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
