
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8405

State of Washington 54th Legislature 1995 Regular Session

By Senators Gaspard, McDonald, Owen and Prince

Read first time 2/15/95.

1 WHEREAS, It is of paramount importance to establish cutoff dates
2 for the consideration of legislation during the 1995 Regular Session of
3 the Fifty-Fourth Legislature;

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
5 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the following
6 cutoff dates apply to all bills, memorials, and joint resolutions with
7 the exception of budgets, matters necessary to implement budgets,
8 initiatives to the legislature, and alternatives to initiatives to the
9 legislature;

10 (1) Wednesday, March 1, 1995, the fifty-second day, will be the
11 final day to read in committee reports in the house of origin with the
12 exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means and Transportation
13 and House of Representatives fiscal committees;

14 (2) Monday, March 6, 1995, the fifty-seventh day, will be the final
15 day to read in Senate Ways and Means and Transportation and House of
16 Representatives fiscal committee reports in the house of origin;

17 (3) Wednesday, March 15, 1995, the sixty-sixth day, at 5:00 p.m.,
18 will be the final time to consider bills in their house of origin;

19 (4) Friday, March 31, 1995, the eighty-second day, will be the
20 final day to read in committee reports on bills from the opposite house

1 with the exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means and
2 Transportation and House of Representatives fiscal committees;

3 (5) Monday, April 3, 1995, the eighty-fifth day, will be the final
4 day to read in Senate Ways and Means and Transportation and House of
5 Representatives fiscal committee reports on bills from the opposite
6 house; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That after 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 14,
8 1995, the ninety-sixth day, neither house may consider any bills,
9 memorials, or joint resolutions except initiatives to the legislature
10 and alternatives to such initiatives, messages pertaining to
11 amendments, matters of differences between the two houses, conference
12 and free conference reports, and matters incident to the interim and to
13 the closing of the business of the 1995 Regular Session of the
14 Legislature.
