- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, THE SECRETARY OF THE UNITED
- 5 STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, The summer of 1994 brought devastating lightning-caused
- 10 wildfires to our state as well as to Oregon and western Canada,
- 11 including a 135,000 acre fire that was this state's largest since 1929;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Those fires burned over 280,000 acres of private, state,
- 14 and federal forest, grass, and range land; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The burned area contains over 700 million board feet of
- 16 timber that will lose commercial value within two years; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Prompt salvage logging of fire-damaged and killed trees
- 18 will permit redemption of some of their commercial value; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Removal of damaged and dead trees will also reduce the
- 20 risk of reburns, such as the three fires that occurred over an 18-year
- 21 period and were sparked by one original fire, the Oregon Tillamook

- 1 fire, as well as reduce future fire risk by reducing fuel for fires;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, Removal of such trees will also help control insects and
- 4 disease, recycle nutrients into soils, and improve wildlife habitat,
- 5 stream flows, and grazing areas, thereby creating a more resilient
- 6 landscape of plants and animals; and
- WHEREAS, Burned areas should be promptly reseeded to protect
- 8 against flood, mud, and erosion damage; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Trail erosion control structures should be built to
- 10 further ensure protection against flood, mud, and erosion damage;
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United
- 12 States Department of Agriculture participate in efforts to ensure the
- 13 long-term health of our natural resources and request that the United
- 14 States Department of Agriculture:
- 15 (1) Conduct salvage logging on all forest lands burned by wildfires
- 16 in 1994 or before;
- 17 (2) Take steps to control diseases and insects preying upon damaged
- 18 and dead trees in burned areas; and
- 19 (3) Reseed and replant seedlings in burned areas in order to
- 20 prevent further damage to those areas.
- 21 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 22 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United
- 23 States, the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture,
- 24 the United States Forest Service, the President of the United States
- 25 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each member of
- 26 Congress from the state of Washington.
