- 1 TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM J. CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 3
- THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO CAROL M. BROWNER, 4
- ADMINISTRATOR OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY: 5
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 federal restrictions WHEREAS, Current on the use of chlorofluorocarbons, such as those found in the air conditioning 10 process, are based on unreliable and unsubstantiated studies; and 11
- 12 WHEREAS, By its very nature, research on the effects 13 chlorofluorocarbons fails to assess entirely the long-term impacts that 14 the use of this class of compounds may have on the environment and 15 particularly on the ozone. Observation of an alleged "hole" in the earth's ozone layer is a recent and unproven phenomenon, and short-term 16 17 research cannot possibly predict with any degree of accuracy a potential threat that chlorofluorocarbons might 18 pose 19 environment. Indeed, studies on alleged ozone depletion do not 20 indicate lasting repercussions resulting from the of

- 1 chlorofluorocarbons, nor that this occurrence is even a consequence of
- 2 human activity; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Observations made by the scientific community regarding
- 4 depletion of the ozone layer have failed to assign responsibility of
- 5 this occurrence to any particular chemical, class of chemicals, or
- 6 chemical process. Furthermore, these studies have not conclusively
- 7 shown there to be a continued threat to the ozone layer into the
- 8 future, nor have they recommended a revision in public policy or social
- 9 life-style regarding the use of chlorofluorocarbons; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Chlorofluorocarbons in the earth's atmosphere are
- 11 minuscule when compared to the vastness of the ozone layer, and it is
- 12 presumptuous to assume that they can substantially affect it. Any
- 13 trivial benefits to be gained from prohibiting the use of
- 14 chlorofluorocarbons do not warrant the economic and social costs
- 15 resulting from such drastic and unnecessary measures;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 17 members of the United States Congress and the officials of the
- 18 Environmental Protection Agency immediately initiate efforts to repeal
- 19 the federal ban on the use of chlorofluorocarbons.
- 20 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 21 transmitted to the Honorable William J. Clinton, President of the
- 22 United States, Carol M. Browner, Administrator of the Environmental
- 23 Protection Agency, the President of the United States Senate, the
- 24 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress
- 25 from the State of Washington.
