7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature has determined that the key to improving our schools is to hold them accountable for achieving results rather than following rules. The energy and the resources of the school system should be focused on what students learn, and on 10 helping them improve learning in order to achieve new, higher academic 11 12 Turning Washington schools into world-class centers for 13 learning will take a partnership of effort and a willingness for 14 schools to develop new curricula and have the freedom to try new school designs and ideas. School districts and schools should be developing 15 16 plans to achieve high academic standards. The legislature finds that 17 individual schools may need certain waivers from laws and rules to help the school achieve high academic standards. The legislature intends 18 that such waivers should be granted for the purpose of improving 19 student learning under our state standards and assessments. 20 21 legislature intends to allow schools to approach their educational 22 mission with both increased flexibility and accountability that will assist them in better meeting the needs of the students in their 23 district. 24

- 9 (4) The duration, renewal, and rescission of the waivers shall be 10 determined by the school district board of directors.
 - (5) The following may not be waived:
 - (a) Laws and rules pertaining to health, safety, and civil rights;
- (b) Provisions of the basic education act relating to certificated instructional staff ratios, RCW 28A.150.100; goals, RCW 28A.150.210; funding allocations, formulas, and definitions, RCW 28A.150.250 and 28A.150.260; and salary and compensation minimum amounts and limitations, RCW 28A.400.200;
- (c) The assessment, accountability, and reporting requirements in RCW 28A.230.190, the fourth grade standardized test; RCW 28A.230.230, the eighth grade standardized test; RCW 28A.230.240, the eleventh grade standardized test; RCW 28A.630.885, assessment requirements as developed by the commission on student learning; and RCW 28A.320.205, the annual performance report;
- 24 (d) Requirements in RCW 28A.150.220 pertaining to the total number 25 of program hours that must be offered;
- 26 (e) State and federal financial reporting and auditing 27 requirements;
 - (f) State constitutional requirements;
 - (g) Mandatory subjects of collective bargaining;
- 30 (h) Terms and conditions of collective bargaining agreements;
- 31 (i) Laws and rules pertaining to special education;
- 32 (j) Laws and rules governing braille instruction under RCW 33 28A.155.105, 28A.155.115, and 28A.410.032;
- (k) Teacher certification requirements in RCW 28A.305.130 (1) through (5), 28A.400.100, and chapter 28A.410 RCW; and
- 36 (1) The essential academic learning requirements being developed by 37 the commission on student learning in RCW 28A.630.885.
- 38 (6) School district boards of directors may not grant waivers that 39 impair contracts or collective bargaining agreements. Understanding

that collective bargaining language can sometimes pose a barrier to change, it is the intent of the legislature to encourage school districts and unions to work together toward agreements that will allow maximum flexibility in order to improve student learning. The granting of waivers of state laws and rules pursuant to chapter . . ., Laws of 1997 (this act) by school district boards of directors as authorized in this section shall not be subject to collective bargaining unless the subject of the waiver request is contained within a collective bargaining agreement.

- (7) School district boards of directors granting waivers to state laws and rules shall certify to the superintendent of public instruction that they have a waiver review process in effect and shall transmit to the superintendent of public instruction and the state board of education a list of laws and rules that have been waived in accordance with this section and a description of the process used in considering the waivers. The superintendent of public instruction and the state board of education shall review the waivers of state laws and rules within their respective jurisdictions. The waivers shall be approved by the superintendent of public instruction or the state board of education, as appropriate, if the school district board of directors complied with the requirements of this section. The superintendent of public instruction or state board of education, as appropriate, shall approve or deny the waiver request, in whole or in part, within forty calendar days of receiving the list of waivers. - (8) School district boards of directors granting waivers shall report annually to the superintendent of public instruction the impact on student learning or delivery of education services resulting from the waivers granted.
- (9) The superintendent of public instruction and state board of education shall report to the legislature by November 1, 2000, the laws

The board of directors of any school district may enter into contracts for their respective districts for periods not exceeding five years in duration with public and private persons, organizations, and entities for the following purposes:

- (1) To rent or lease building space, portable buildings, security systems, computers and other equipment. A school district administrator or principal may obtain, in accordance with section 2 of this act, waivers from the five-year restriction. Waivers also may be obtained, in accordance with section 2 of this act, from any rules of the state board of education and superintendent of public instruction adopted to implement the statutory requirements;
- 28 (2) To have maintained and repaired security systems, computers and 29 other equipment; and
 - (3) To provide pupil transportation services.

No school district may enter into a contract for pupil transportation unless it has notified the superintendent of public instruction that, in the best judgment of the district, the cost of contracting will not exceed the projected cost of operating its own pupil transportation.

The budget of each school district shall identify that portion of each contractual liability incurred pursuant to this section extending

- beyond the fiscal year by amount, duration, and nature of the contracted service and/or item in accordance with rules and regulations of the superintendent of public instruction adopted pursuant to RCW 28A.505.140 and 28A.310.330.
- The provisions of this section shall not have any effect on the length of contracts for school district employees specified by RCW 28A.400.300 and 28A.405.210."

EFFECT: The provisions in the second substitute bill concerning collective bargaining agreements are either modified or stricken. affirmative statement is made that school districts may not waive mandatory subjects of collective bargaining and terms and conditions of collective bargaining agreements. An affirmative statement is also made that the legislature intends to encourage unions and employers to work together toward agreements that will allow maximum flexibility to improve student learning. The provision in the bill concerning conditions of probation is stricken. The waiver provisions governing certificated and classified employees are stricken. The waiver provisions in the chapters governing teacher certification, special education, sexual equality, and bilingual education are stricken. principal must seek the substantial involvement of the superintendent, teachers, parents, and the site council. The site council must approve application. Waivers may only be granted to schools that participate in the assessment provisions under education goals. and SBE must review implementation of the act to determine if the waivers are meeting the stated objectives.
