disciplinary proceedings according to federal timelines 1 and requirements, and consistent with the administrative procedure act, 2 chapter 34.05 RCW. If the department of social and health services 25 makes a preliminary determination, based upon credible evidence and an investigation by the department, that a licensed, certified, or 26 registered health care provider listed in RCW 18.130.040 and used by 27 the nursing home to provide services to a resident, except for a 28 29 certified or registered nursing assistant, has neglected or abused a 30 resident or misappropriated a resident's property, the department of social and health services shall immediately refer its determination 31 regarding the individual to the department of health or disciplining 32 authority, as defined in RCW 18.130.020. EFFECT: Clarifies that DSHS makes the preliminary investigation and determination as to whether abuse, neglect or misappropriation of property occurred in a nursing home and then most individual health care providers are referred to the Department of Health or a disciplining authority for disciplinary proceedings. With this amendment, no individual will be subject to two administrative fair hearings or two disciplinary proceedings.

 Clarifies that DSHS operates the nursing home resident protection program for nursing assistants and nonlicensed nursing home personnel. Clarifies when referrals of preliminarily substantiated complaints are sent by DSHS to the disciplining authorities, the communication of final findings and orders back to DSHS, and prescribes when such information may be released by DSHS.

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
