9 (1) No state officer or state employee may receive any thing of
10 economic value under any contract or grant outside of his or her
11 official duties. The prohibition in this subsection does not apply
12 where the state officer or state employee has complied with RCW
13 42.52.030(2) or each of the following conditions are met:

14 (a) The contract or grant is bona fide and actually performed;

15 (b) The performance or administration of the contract or grant is
16 not within the course of the officer's or employee's official duties,
17 or is not under the officer's or employee's official supervision;

18 (c) The performance of the contract or grant is not prohibited by
19 RCW 42.52.040 or by applicable laws or rules governing outside
20 employment for the officer or employee;

21 (d) The contract or grant is neither performed for nor compensated
22 by any person from whom such officer or employee would be prohibited by
23 RCW 42.52.150(4) from receiving a gift;

24 (e) The contract or grant is not one expressly created or
25 authorized by the officer or employee in his or her official capacity
26 (~~or by his or her agency~~);

27 (f) The contract or grant would not require unauthorized disclosure
28 of confidential information.

29 (2) In addition to satisfying the requirements of subsection (1) of
30 this section, a state officer or state employee may have a beneficial
31 interest in a grant or contract with a state agency only if:

32 (a) The contract or grant is awarded or issued as a result of an
33 open and competitive bidding process in which more than one bid or
34 grant application was received; or

35 (b) The contract or grant is awarded or issued as a result of an
36 open and competitive bidding or selection process in which the

1 officer's or employee's bid or proposal was the only bid or proposal
2 received and the officer or employee has been advised by the
3 appropriate ethics board, before execution of the contract or grant,
4 that the contract or grant would not be in conflict with the proper
5 discharge of the officer's or employee's official duties; or

6 (c) The process for awarding the contract or issuing the grant is
7 not open and competitive, but the officer or employee has been advised
8 by the appropriate ethics board that the contract or grant would not be
9 in conflict with the proper discharge of the officer's or employee's
10 official duties.

11 (3) A state officer or state employee awarded a contract or issued
12 a grant in compliance with subsection (2) of this section shall file
13 the contract or grant with the appropriate ethics board within thirty
14 days after the date of execution; however, if proprietary formulae,
15 designs, drawings, or research are included in the contract or grant,
16 the proprietary formulae, designs, drawings, or research may be deleted
17 from the contract or grant filed with the appropriate ethics board.

18 (4) This section does not prevent a state officer or state employee
19 from receiving compensation contributed from the treasury of the United
20 States, another state, county, or municipality if the compensation is
21 received pursuant to arrangements entered into between such state,
22 county, municipality, or the United States and the officer's or
23 employee's agency. This section does not prohibit a state officer or
24 state employee from serving or performing any duties under an
25 employment contract with a governmental entity.

26 (5) As used in this section, "officer" and "employee" do not
27 include officers and employees who, in accordance with the terms of
28 their employment or appointment, are serving without compensation from
29 the state of Washington or are receiving from the state only
30 reimbursement of expenses incurred or a predetermined allowance for
31 such expenses."
