- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 Sec. 1. (1) The legislature recognizes that "NEW SECTION. 8 coordinated funding efforts are needed to maintain, develop, and 9 improve the state's community outdoor athletic fields. 10 population growth and increased urbanization have caused a decline in suitable outdoor fields for community athletic activities and has 11 12 resulted in overcrowding and deterioration of existing surfaces. Lack 13 of adequate community outdoor athletic fields directly affects the health and well-being of all citizens of the state, reduces the state's 14 15 economic viability, and prevents Washington from maintaining and 16 achieving the quality of life that it deserves. Therefore, it is the policy of the state and its agencies to maintain, develop, fund, and 17 improve youth or community athletic facilities, including but not 18 19 limited to community outdoor athletic fields.
- 20 (2) In carrying out this policy, the legislature intends to promote the building of new community outdoor athletic fields, the upgrading of 21 existing community outdoor athletic fields, and the maintenance of 22 existing community outdoor athletic fields across the state of 23 24 The purpose of sections 1 through 4 of this act is to Washington. 25 create an advisory council to provide information and advice to the 26 interagency committee for outdoor recreation in the distribution of the 27 funds in the youth athletic facility grant account established in RCW 28 43.99N.060(4).
- 29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) A community outdoor athletic fields advisory council is established within the interagency committee for 30 The advisory council shall consist of nine 31 outdoor recreation. members, from the public at large, appointed as follows: 32 33 members appointed by the chairperson of the interagency committee for 34 outdoor recreation; (b) two members appointed by the house of 35 representatives, one each by the speaker of the house of

and the minority leader of the of 1 representatives house 2 representatives; and (c) two members appointed by the senate, one each appointed by the majority leader of the senate and the minority leader 3 4 of the senate. The appointments must reflect an effort to achieve a 5 balance among the appointed members based upon factors of geographic, racial, ethnic, and gender diversity, and with a sense and awareness of 6 7 community outdoor athletic field needs.

- (2) The advisory council shall provide information to and make recommendations to the interagency committee for outdoor recreation on the award of funds from the youth athletic facility grant account created in RCW 43.99N.060(4), to cities, counties, and qualified nonprofit organizations for acquiring, developing, equipping, maintaining, and improving youth or community athletic facilities, including but not limited to community outdoor athletic fields.
- 15 (3) The members shall serve three-year terms. Of the initial 16 members, two shall be appointed for a one-year term, three shall be 17 appointed for a two-year term, and the remainder shall be appointed for three-year terms. Thereafter, members shall be appointed for three-18 19 year terms. The chairperson of the interagency committee for outdoor 20 recreation shall appoint one of the members to serve as chairperson of the advisory council for the duration of the member's term. 21
- 22 (4) Members of the advisory council shall serve without 23 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided 24 in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. Subject to available resources, the interagency committee for outdoor recreation, in consultation with the community outdoor athletic fields advisory council may:
- (1) Prepare and update a strategic plan for the development, maintenance, and improvement of community outdoor athletic fields in the state. In the preparation of such plan, the interagency committee for outdoor recreation may use available data from federal, state, and local agencies having community outdoor athletic responsibilities, user groups, private sector interests, and the general public. The plan may include, but is not limited to:
 - (a) An inventory of current community outdoor athletic fields;
 - (b) A forecast of demand for these fields;
- 37 (c) An identification and analysis of actual and potential funding 38 sources; and

- 1 (d) Other information the interagency committee for outdoor 2 recreation deems appropriate to carry out the purposes of sections 1 3 through 4 of this act;
- 4 (2) Determine the eligibility requirements for cities, counties, 5 and qualified nonprofit organizations to access funding from the youth 6 athletic facility grant account created in RCW 43.99N.060(4);
- 7 (3) Encourage and provide opportunities for interagency and 8 regional coordination and cooperative efforts between public agencies 9 and between public entities and nonprofit organizations involved in the 10 maintenance, development, and improvement of community outdoor athletic 11 fields; and
- 12 (4) Create and maintain data, studies, research, and other 13 information relating to community outdoor athletic fields in the state, 14 and to encourage the exchange of this information.
- 15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The interagency committee for outdoor recreation may receive gifts, grants, or endowments from public and 16 private sources that are made from time to time, in trust or otherwise, 17 18 for the use and benefit of the purposes of sections 1 through 4 of this 19 act and spend gifts, grants, or endowments or income from the public or private sources according to their terms, unless the receipt of the 20 21 gifts, grants, or endowments violates RCW 42.17.710.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 4 of this act expire one year after RCW 82.14.0494 expires.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. Sections 1 through 6 of this act are each added to chapter 43.99 RCW under the subchapter heading "youth or community athletic facilities.""
- 31 Correct the title.

EFFECT: The striking amendment: (a) creates the advisory committee in the IAC; (b) advisory committee membership is increased from 5 to 9; (c) removes \$50 per day compensation and only provides standard reimbursement for travel expenses; (d) makes duties responsibility of IAC, in consultation with advisory committee, subject to available resources; (e) clarifies that IAC, in consultation with advisory committee, awards grants from youth athletic grant account to cities, counties, and qualified nonprofit organizations; (f) allows IAC to accept gifts, grants, and endowments for purpose of community outdoor athletic fields; and (g) places statutes as subchapter in IAC law under heading "Community Outdoor Athletic Fields."
