The department of health shall update 13 the estimated state-wide average residential water rate by July 1 of 14 15 each year that this section remains in effect.

- 19 (1) This chapter does not apply to amounts received for water 20 services supplied by a water-sewer district established under Title 57 21 RCW that has been certified by the department of health as:

- 23 (b) Charging residential water rates that exceed one hundred 24 twenty-five percent of the state-wide average water rate.
