**Background:** The state government operates on the basis of a fiscal biennium that begins on July 1 of each odd-numbered year. A biennial operating budget was enacted in the 1995 legislative session, appropriating \$17.599 billion from the state general fund. A supplemental operating budget was enacted in the 1996 legislative session increasing the state general fund appropriation by \$12 million for a total of \$17.611 billion. The bill increases the state general fund appropriation by \$166 million for a state general fund total of \$17.778 billion.

**Summary of Substitute Bill:** The 1996 supplemental operating budget is amended to increase state general fund appropriations by \$100 million for a total of \$17.711 billion.

**Substitute Bill Compared to Original Bill:** The substitute bill lowers the state general fund appropriation by \$66 million, increasing existing appropriations by \$100 million.

**Appropriation:** See bill.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

Effective Date of Substitute Bill: The bill contains an emergency clause and takes

effect immediately.
