

ANALYSIS OF HOUSE BILL 2482

Accessing specialty health care services.

SPONSORS: Representatives Schloss and Sump.

PURPOSE: To establish standards for certain types of hospital consultations.

BACKGROUND: For the most part a physician access to a second opinion or consultation from teaching and tertiary hospitals depends on the coverage he receives from the patient's health plan and hospitalization, which may cause inconsistency. For example, Seattle physicians are most likely to get a second opinion from University Hospital than their counterparts in rural areas of Eastern Washington. Proponents of this measure feel that this is unfair because of the hospitals' support of taxes drawn from all regions of the state.

SUMMARY: The Administration proposes to expand the basic health plan and employer health carrier offerings to provide coverage for hospital services performed by doctors of Medicine and Osteopathy who are treating over persons at one time by access consultation or insertion at a single tertiary hospital. Hospitals involved include Children's, Seattle, Mary Bridge, Tacoma, and Olympia.

Carriers are establishing standards for this access.

Standard medical plans are not established in necessary medical services authorized.
