State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

- AN ACT Relating to license plates; amending RCW 46.16.270,
- 2 46.16.290, 46.16.301, 46.16.305, 46.16.309, 46.16.313, 46.16.316,
- 3 46.16.350, 46.16.650, 73.04.110, and 73.04.115; adding new sections to
- 4 chapter 46.16 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the proliferation
- 7 of special license plate series has decreased the ready identification
- 8 of vehicles by law enforcement, and increased the amount of computer
- 9 programming conducted by the department of licensing, thereby
- 10 increasing costs. Furthermore, rarely has the actual demand for
- 11 special license plates met the requesters' projections. Most
- 12 importantly, special plates detract from the primary purpose of license
- 13 plates, that of vehicle identification.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 Except for those license plates issued under RCW 46.16.305(1)
- 17 before January 1, 1987, and under RCW 46.16.305(3), effective with
- 18 vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 2001, all

- 1 vehicle license plates must be issued on a standard background, as 2 designated by the department.
- 3 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.16.270 and 1990 c 250 s 32 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- ((Replacement plates issued after January 1, 1987, will be centennial plates as described in RCW 46.16.650.)) The total replacement plate fee ((including the one dollar per plate centennial plate fee)) shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund.

Upon the loss, defacement, or destruction of one or both of the 9 10 vehicle license number plates issued for any vehicle where more than one plate was originally issued or where one or both have become so 11 illegible or in such a condition as to be difficult to distinguish, or 12 upon the owner's option, the owner of the vehicle shall make 13 14 application for new vehicle license number plates upon a form furnished 15 by the director. The application shall be filed with the director or the director's authorized agent, accompanied by the certificate of 16 license registration of the vehicle and a fee in the amount of three 17 18 dollars per plate, whereupon the director, or the director's authorized 19 agent, shall issue new vehicle license number plates to the applicant. It shall be accompanied by a fee of two dollars for a new motorcycle 20 license number plate. In the event the director has issued license 21 period tabs or a windshield emblem instead of vehicle license number 22 23 plates, and upon the loss, defacement, or destruction of the tabs or 24 windshield emblem, application shall be made on a form provided by the 25 director and in the same manner as above described, and shall be accompanied by a fee of one dollar for each pair of tabs or for each 26 windshield emblem, whereupon the director shall issue to the applicant 27 a duplicate pair of tabs, year tabs, and when necessary month tabs or 28 29 a windshield emblem to replace those lost, defaced, or destroyed. For 30 vehicles owned, rented, or leased by the state of Washington or by any county, city, town, school district, or other political subdivision of 31 32 the state of Washington or United States government, or owned or leased by the governing body of an Indian tribe as defined in RCW 46.16.020, 33 34 a fee shall be charged for replacement of a vehicle license number plate only to the extent required by the provisions of RCW 46.16.020, 35 36 46.16.061, 46.16.237, and 46.01.140. For vehicles owned, rented, or leased by foreign countries or international bodies to which the United 37 States government is a signatory by treaty, the payment of any fee for 38

1 the replacement of a vehicle license number plate shall not be 2 required.

3 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.16.290 and 1986 c 18 s 18 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 In any case of a valid sale or transfer of the ownership of any vehicle, the right to the certificates properly transferable therewith, 6 7 except as provided in RCW 46.16.280, and to the vehicle license plates passes to the purchaser or transferee. It is unlawful for the holder 8 9 of such certificates, except as provided in RCW 46.16.280, or vehicle license plates to fail, neglect, or refuse to endorse the certificates 10 and deliver the vehicle license plates to the purchaser or transferee. 11 If the sale or transfer is of a vehicle licensed by the state or any 12 county, city, town, school district, or other political subdivision 13 14 entitled to exemption as provided by law, or, if the vehicle is 15 licensed with personalized plates, amateur radio operator plates, medal of honor plates, disabled person plates, disabled veteran plates, 16 ((or)) prisoner of war plates, or other special license plates issued 17 18 under RCW 46.16.301 as it existed before amendment by section 5 of this 19 act, the vehicle license plates therefor shall be retained and may be displayed upon a vehicle obtained in replacement of the vehicle so sold 20 21 or transferred.

- 22 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.16.301 and 1995 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 102 are each 23 amended to read as follows:
- (((1) The department may create, design, and issue special license plates that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to display two motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the department. The special plates may:
- 30 (a) Denote the age or type of vehicle; or
- 31 (b) Denote special activities or interests; or
- 32 (c) Denote the status, or contribution or sacrifice for the United 33 States, the state of Washington, or the citizens of the state of
- 34 Washington, of a registered owner of that vehicle; or
- 35 (d) Display a depiction of the name and mascot or symbol of a state
- 36 university, regional university, or state college as defined in RCW

37 28B.10.016.

(2))) The department shall create, design, and issue a special 1 2 baseball stadium license plate that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to display two 3 4 motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the 5 department. The special plates shall commemorate the construction of 6 7 a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485. The department shall 8 also issue to each recipient of a special baseball stadium license 9 plate a certificate of participation in the construction of the 10 baseball stadium.

((3) The department has the sole discretion to determine whether or not to create, design, or issue any series of special license plates, other than the special baseball stadium license plate under subsection (2) of this section, and whether any interest or status merits the issuance of a series of special license plates. In making this determination, the department shall consider whether or not an interest or status contributes or has contributed significantly to the public health, safety, or welfare of the citizens of the United States or of this state or to their significant benefit, or whether the interest or status is recognized by the United States, this state, or other states, in other settings or contexts. The department may also consider the potential number of persons who may be eligible for the plates and the cost and efficiency of producing limited numbers of the plates. The design of a special license plate shall conform to all requirements for plates for the type of vehicle for which it is issued, as provided elsewhere in this chapter.))

27 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.16.305 and 1990 c 250 s 2 are each amended to read 28 as follows:

29 The department shall continue to issue((, under RCW 46.16.301 and 30 the department's rules implementing RCW 46.16.301 through 46.16.332,)) the categories of special plates issued by the department under the 31 sections repealed under section $((\frac{13}{2}))$ $\underline{12}$ (1) through (7), chapter 250, 32 33 Laws of 1990. Special license plates issued under those repealed sections before January 1, 1991, are valid to the extent and under the 34 conditions provided in those repealed sections. 35 The following 36 conditions, limitations, or requirements apply to certain special 37 license plates issued after January 1, 1991:

- (1) A horseless carriage plate and a plate or plates issued for collectors' vehicles more than thirty years old, upon payment of the initial fees required by law and the additional special license plate fee established by the department, are valid for the life of the vehicle for which application is approved by the department. When a single plate is issued, it shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle.
- 8 (2) The department may issue special license plates denoting 9 amateur radio operator status only to persons having a valid official 10 radio operator license issued ((for a term of five years)) by the 11 federal communications commission.
- 12 (3) The department shall issue one set of special license plates to
 13 each resident of this state who has been awarded the Congressional
 14 Medal of Honor for use on a passenger vehicle other than a motor home,
 15 registered to that person. The department shall issue the plate
 16 without the payment of ((any)) licensing fees and motor vehicle excise
 17 tax.
- (4) The department may issue for use on only one motor vehicle owned by the qualified applicant special license plates denoting that the recipient of the plate is a survivor of the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, to persons meeting all of the following criteria:
 - (a) Is a resident of this state;

- (b) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on December 7, 24 1941;
- 25 (c) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 26 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the island of Oahu, or 27 offshore at a distance not to exceed three miles;
- 28 (d) Received an honorable discharge from the United States Armed 29 Forces; and
- (e) Is certified by a Washington state chapter of the Pearl Harbor survivors association as satisfying the qualifications in (c) of this subsection.
 - The department may issue such plates to the surviving spouse of any deceased Pearl Harbor survivor who met the requirements of this subsection. If the surviving spouse remarries, he or she shall return the special plates to the department within fifteen days and apply for regular plates. The surviving spouse must be a resident of this state.
- The department shall issue these plates upon payment by the applicant of all other license fees, but the department may not set or

- 1 charge an additional fee for these special license plates (($\frac{\text{under RCW}}{2}$ 2 $\frac{46.16.313}{10.000}$).
- (5) The department shall replace, free of charge, special license plates issued under subsections (3) and (4) of this section if they are lost, stolen, damaged, defaced, or destroyed. Such plates shall remain with the persons upon transfer or other disposition of the vehicle for which they were initially issued, and may be used on another vehicle registered to the recipient in accordance with the provisions of RCW 46.16.316(1).
- 10 **Sec. 7.** RCW 46.16.309 and 1990 c 250 s 3 are each amended to read 11 as follows:
- Persons applying to the department for special license plates shall apply on forms obtained from the department and in accordance with RCW 46.16.040. The applicant shall provide all information as is required by the department in order to determine the applicant's eligibility for ((such)) the special license plates ((and for administration of RCW 46.16.301 through 46.16.332)).
- 18 **Sec. 8.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1996 c 165 s 506 are each amended to 19 read as follows:
- 20 (1) The department may establish a fee for each type of special license plates issued under RCW 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c), as 21 22 existing before amendment by section 5 of this act, in an amount 23 calculated to offset the cost of production of the special license 24 plates and the administration of this program. Until December 31, 1997, the fee shall not exceed thirty-five dollars ((and)), but 25 effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 26 27 1998, the department may adjust the fee to no more than forty dollars. 28 This fee is in addition to all other fees required to register and 29 license the vehicle for which the plates have been requested. All such additional special license plate fees collected by the department shall 30 31 be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the motor vehicle 32 fund.
- 33 (2) <u>Until December 31, 1997, in addition to all fees and taxes</u>
 34 required to be paid upon application, registration, and renewal

The remaining proceeds shall be 14 remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper 15 identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the 16 funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in 17 RCW 28B.10.890. 18
- 19 (4) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 1, 1999, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 20 renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a collegiate 21 license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall 22 23 deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under 24 this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the 25 26 state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license 27 plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890. 28
- 29 (5) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 30 application((,)) and registration((, and renewal registration))) of a31 motor vehicle, the holder of a special baseball stadium license plate shall pay ((a)) an initial fee of ((thirty)) forty dollars. 32 department shall deduct an amount not to exceed ((two)) twelve dollars 33 34 of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and 35 collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to a county for the 36 37 purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 38 39 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while

- 23 **Sec. 10.** RCW 46.16.316 and 1990 c 250 s 5 are each amended to read 24 as follows:
- 25 Except as provided in RCW 46.16.305:
- (1) When a person who has been issued a special license plate or 26 plates under RCW 46.16.301 as it existed before amendment by section 5 27 28 of this act, sells, trades, or otherwise transfers or releases 29 ownership of the vehicle upon which the special license plate or plates have been displayed, he or she shall immediately report the transfer of 30 such plate or plates to an acquired vehicle or vehicle eligible for 31 such plates pursuant to departmental rule, or he or she shall surrender 32 33 such plates to the department immediately if such surrender is required by departmental rule. If a person applies for a transfer of the plate 34 35 or plates to another eligible vehicle, a transfer fee of five dollars shall be charged in addition to all other applicable fees. 36

- 32 in addition to all other appropriate fees. The department may
- 33 periodically verify the one hundred percent rate as provided in
- 34 subsection (4) of this section.
- 35 Any person who has been issued free motor vehicle license plates
- 36 under this section prior to July 1, 1983, shall continue to be eligible
- 37 for the annual free license plates.

- For the purposes of this section, "blind" means the definition of "blind" used by the state of Washington in determining eligibility for financial assistance to the blind under Title 74 RCW.
- 4 Any unauthorized use of a special plate is a gross misdemeanor.
- 5 **Sec. 14.** RCW 73.04.115 and 1990 c 250 s 91 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- The department shall issue to the surviving spouse of any deceased former prisoner of war described in RCW 73.04.110(2), one set of regular or special license plates for use on a personal passenger vehicle, other than a motor home as defined by RCW 46.04.305, registered to that person.
- The plates shall be issued or renewed annually without the payment 12 of any license fees or excise tax on the vehicle. Whenever any person 13 14 who has been issued license plates under this section applies to the 15 department for transfer of the plates to a subsequently acquired motor vehicle, a transfer fee of five dollars shall be charged in addition to 16 all other appropriate fees. If the surviving spouse remarries, he or 17 18 she shall return the special plates to the department within fifteen 19 days and apply for regular license plates.
