- 1 AN ACT Relating to removing a child from school grounds; and
- 2 amending RCW 28A.605.010.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.605.010 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 248 s 1 are each 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 The board of directors of each school district by rule or
- 7 regulation shall set forth proper procedure to ensure that each school
- 8 within their district is carrying out district policy providing that no
- 9 child ((will)) may be removed from any school grounds or building
- 10 thereon during school hours except by a person so authorized by a
- 11 parent or legal guardian having legal custody thereof((: PROVIDED,
- 12 That such rules and regulations need not be applicable to any child in
- 13 grades nine through twelve)). Such rules shall be applicable to school
- 14 employees or their designees who may not remove, cause to be removed,
- 15 or allow to be removed, any student from school grounds without
- 16 authorization from the student's parent or legal guardian unless the
- 17 employee is: The student's parent, legal guardian, or immediate family
- 18 member, a school employee providing school bus transportation services
- 19 in accordance with chapter 28A.160 RCW, a school employee supervising

- 1 an extracurricular activity in which the student is participating and
- 2 the employee is providing transportation to or from the activity; or,
- 3 the student is in need of emergent medical care, and the employee is
- 4 <u>unable to reach the parent for transportation of the student. School</u>
- 5 <u>security personnel may remove a student from school grounds without</u>
- 6 parental authorization for disciplinary reasons.
