AN ACT Relating to state agencies issuing federal employer identification numbers; adding a new section to chapter 19.02 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.07 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.22 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 50.12 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 82.02 RCW; creating a new section; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature intends to simplify the 9 process of registering and licensing businesses in this state by 10 authorizing state agencies to provide consolidated forms, instructions, service locations, and other operations whenever coordination of these 11 functions would benefit individual businesses and the business 12 13 community of this state. To further this goal, agencies participating 14 in the master business license program should be able to contract with 15 the federal department of internal revenue services to issue a 16 conditional federal employer identification number at the same time 17 that a business applies for registration or licensing with any state 18 agency.
