- 1 AN ACT Relating to recognizing teaching degrees in deaf education
- 2 from a program approved by the council on education of the deaf; adding
- 3 a new section to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an opportunity
- 6 exists to improve the overall educational development of deaf and hard
- 7 of hearing children by increasing access to teachers who have been
- 8 trained at a college or university approved by the council on education
- 9 of the deaf. Educators who received teacher training in a program for
- 10 the deaf and hard of hearing are sensitive to the needs of deaf and
- 11 hard of hearing students and are able to provide appropriate strategies
- 12 to assist students in reacting and interacting with their environment.
- 13 The legislature further finds that it is necessary to provide deaf and
- 14 hard of hearing students with greater learning opportunities to develop
- 15 the unique strategies and perceptions shared in deaf culture and to
- 16 optimize their potential in today's world. It is the legislature's
- 17 intent to increase these opportunities by eliminating identified
- 18 barriers to educators who are uniquely qualified to instruct students
- 19 who are deaf and hard of hearing.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 2 RCW to read as follows:

In establishing rules for certification, the state board of education shall waive the special education endorsement requirements for applicants who possess a baccalaureate or master's degree in deaf education from a teacher training program approved by the council on education of the deaf, and who intend to provide instruction to deaf or hard of hearing children.
