- 1 AN ACT Relating to recognizing teaching degrees in deaf education
- 2 from a program approved by the council on education of the deaf; adding
- 3 a new section to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an opportunity
- 6 exists to improve the overall educational development of deaf and hard
- 7 of hearing children by increasing access to educators who are
- 8 themselves deaf or hard of hearing. The culture shared between deaf
- 9 and hard of hearing educators and deaf and hard of hearing students

- 1 identified barriers to the certification of deaf and hard of hearing
- 2 educators who are able to provide these unique educational services.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 4 RCW to read as follows:
- In establishing rules for certification, the state board of education shall waive the requirement for a special education endorsement for those individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing and intend to provide instruction to deaf or hard of hearing children if the individual possesses a baccalaureate or master's degree in deaf education from a program approved by the council on education of the deaf.
