- 1 AN ACT Relating to feeding wildlife during episodes of severe

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that, during
  - severe winter weather conditions, big game herds of deer and elk living
- 7 on limited winter ranges are at risk of starvation and may be driven to
- 8 forage on private property, damaging crops and other vegetation. It
- 9 is, therefore, in the public interest to feed deer and elk on an
- 10 emergency basis when such conditions occur.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The sum of one million four hundred thirty-
- 12 eight thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is
- 13 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1997, from the general
- 14 fund to the department of fish and wildlife. The amount appropriated
- 15 in this section is provided solely for the emergency feeding of deer
- 16 and elk that may be at risk of starvation and are posing a risk to
- 17 crops or other private property due to severe winter conditions
- 18 beginning in early November 1996 and forecast to continue until March

- 1 1997. If any of the moneys provided in this section remain unexpended
- 2 after March 31, 1997, such moneys shall revert to the general fund to

- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 8 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 9 immediately.
