- 1 AN ACT Relating to special district commissioner per diem
- 2 compensation; and amending RCW 35.61.150, 52.14.010, 53.12.260,
- 3 57.12.010, and 36.57A.050.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 35.61.150 and 1965 c 7 s 35.61.150 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Metropolitan park commissioners shall perform their duties
- 8 ((without compensation)) and may provide, by resolution passed by the
- 9 commissioners, for the payment of compensation to each of its
- 10 commissioners at a rate of sixty-six dollars for each day or portion of
- 11 a day devoted to the business of the district. However, the
- 12 compensation for each commissioner must not exceed six thousand three
- 13 hundred thirty-six dollars per year.
- 14 Any commissioner may waive all or any portion of his or her
- 15 compensation payable under this section as to any month or months
- 16 during his or her term of office, by a written waiver filed with the
- 17 clerk of the board. The waiver, to be effective, must be filed any
- 18 time after the commissioner's election and prior to the date on which

- 1 the compensation would otherwise be paid. The waiver shall specify the
- 2 month or period of months for which it is made.
- 3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 52.14.010 and 1994 c 223 s 48 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- The affairs of the district shall be managed by a board of fire 5 commissioners composed of three registered voters residing in the 6 7 district except as provided in RCW 52.14.015 and 52.14.020. member shall each receive fifty dollars per day or portion thereof, not 8 9 to exceed four thousand eight hundred dollars per year, for attendance at board meetings and for performance of other services in behalf of 10 Except the commissioners, by resolution, may increase 11 the district. the payment of per diem compensation to each of its commissioners from 12 fifty dollars up to sixty-six dollars per day or portion of a day, not 13 14 to exceed six thousand three hundred thirty-six dollars per year, for 15 attendance at board meetings and for performance of other services in behalf of the district. 16
- In addition, they shall receive necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the board or when otherwise engaged in district business, and shall be entitled to receive the same insurance available to all fire fighters of the district: PROVIDED, That the premiums for such insurance, except liability insurance, shall be paid by the individual commissioners who elect to receive it.
 - Any commissioner may waive all or any portion of his or her compensation payable under this section as to any month or months during his or her term of office, by a written waiver filed with the secretary as provided in this section. The waiver, to be effective, must be filed any time after the commissioner's election and prior to the date on which the compensation would otherwise be paid. The waiver shall specify the month or period of months for which it is made.
- The board shall fix the compensation to be paid the secretary and all other agents and employees of the district. The board may, by resolution adopted by unanimous vote, authorize any of its members to serve as volunteer fire fighters without compensation. A commissioner actually serving as a volunteer fire fighter may enjoy the rights and benefits of a volunteer fire fighter.
- 36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 53.12.260 and 1992 c 146 s 12 are each amended to read 37 as follows:

28 29 (1) Each commissioner of a port district shall receive ((fifty)) sixty-six dollars per day or portion thereof spent (a) in actual attendance at official meetings of the port district commission, or (b) in performance of other service in behalf of the district. The total per diem compensation of a port commissioner shall not exceed ((four thousand eight hundred)) six thousand three hundred thirty-six dollars in a year, or ((six)) seven thousand nine hundred twenty dollars in any year for a port district with gross operating income of twenty-five million or more in the preceding calendar year.

- (2) Port commissioners shall receive additional compensation as follows: (a) Each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of twenty-five million dollars or more in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars per month; and (b) each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of from one million dollars to less than twenty-five million dollars in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of two hundred dollars per month.
- 18 (3) In lieu of the compensation specified in this section, a port 19 commission may set compensation to be paid to commissioners.
 - (4) For any commissioner who has not elected to become a member of public employees retirement system before May 1, 1975, the compensation provided pursuant to this section shall not be considered salary for purposes of the provisions of any retirement system created pursuant to the general laws of this state nor shall attendance at such meetings or other service on behalf of the district constitute service as defined in RCW 41.40.010(9): PROVIDED, That in the case of a port district when commissioners are receiving compensation and contributing to the public employees retirement system, these benefits shall continue in full force and effect notwithstanding the provisions of RCW 53.12.260 and 53.12.265.
- **Sec. 4.** RCW 57.12.010 and 1996 c 230 s 401 are each amended to 32 read as follows:
- The governing body of a district shall be a board of commissioners consisting of three members, or five members as provided in RCW 57.12.015, or more, as provided in the event of merger or consolidation. The board shall annually elect one of its members as president and another as secretary.

The board shall by resolution adopt rules governing the transaction of its business and shall adopt an official seal. All proceedings shall be by resolution recorded in a book kept for that purpose which shall be a public record.

A district shall provide by resolution for the payment of compensation to each of its commissioners at a rate of fifty dollars for each day or portion thereof devoted to the business of the district. However the compensation for each commissioner shall not exceed four thousand eight hundred dollars per year. Except the commissioners, by resolution, may increase the payment of per diem compensation to each of its commissioners from fifty dollars up to sixty-six dollars for each day or portion of a day devoted to the business of the district. However, the compensation for each commissioner may not exceed six thousand three hundred thirty-six dollars per year. In addition, the secretary may be paid a reasonable sum for clerical services.

Any commissioner may waive all or any portion of his or her compensation payable under this section as to any month or months during the commissioner's term of office, by a written waiver filed with the district at any time after the commissioner's election and prior to the date on which the compensation would otherwise be paid. The waiver shall specify the month or period of months for which it is made.

No commissioner shall be employed full time by the district. A commissioner shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses actually incurred in connection with district business, including subsistence and lodging while away from the commissioner's place of residence and mileage for use of a privately-owned vehicle at the mileage rate authorized in RCW 43.03.060.

Sec. 5. RCW 36.57A.050 and 1983 c 65 s 3 are each amended to read 31 as follows:

Within sixty days of the establishment of the boundaries of the public transportation benefit area the members of the county legislative authority and the elected representative of each city within the area shall provide for the selection of the governing body of such area, the public transportation benefit area authority, which shall consist of elected officials selected by and serving at the pleasure of the governing bodies of component cities within the area

1 and the county legislative authority of each county within the area.

2 If at the time a public transportation benefit area authority assumes

the public transportation functions previously provided under the

4 Interlocal Cooperation Act (chapter 39.34 RCW) there are citizen

5 positions on the governing board of the transit system, those positions

6 may be retained as positions on the governing board of the public

7 transportation benefit area authority.

 Within such sixty-day period, any city may by resolution of its legislative body withdraw from participation in the public transportation benefit area. The county legislative authority and each city remaining in the public transportation benefit area may disapprove and prevent the establishment of any governing body of a public transportation benefit area if the composition thereof does not meet its approval.

In no case shall the governing body of a single county public transportation benefit area be greater than nine members and in the case of a multicounty area, fifteen members. Those cities within the transportation benefit area and excluded from direct membership on the authority are hereby authorized to designate a member of the authority who shall be entitled to represent the interests of such city which is excluded from direct membership on the authority. The legislative body of such city shall notify the authority as to the determination of its authorized representative on the authority.

Each member of the authority is eligible to be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 and to receive compensation, as set by the authority, in an amount not to exceed forty-four dollars for each day during which the member attends official meetings of the authority or performs prescribed duties approved by the chairman of the authority. Except that the authority may, by resolution, increase the payment of per diem compensation to each member from forty-four dollars up to sixty-six dollars per day or portion of a day for attendance at board meetings and for performance of other services on behalf of the authority. In no event may a member be compensated in any year for more than seventy-five days, except the chairman who may be paid compensation for not more than one hundred days: PROVIDED, That compensation shall not be paid to an elected official or employee of federal, state, or local government who is
