- 1 AN ACT Relating to the information services board; amending RCW
- 2 43.105.032, 43.105.190, and 42.17.2401; reenacting and amending RCW
- 3 43.105.041; and adding a new section to chapter 43.105 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.105.032 and 1996 c 137 s 10 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 There is hereby created the Washington state information services
- 8 board. The board shall be composed of ((thirteen)) fifteen members.
- 9 Eight members shall be appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be
- 10 a representative of higher education, one of whom shall be a
- 11 representative of an agency under a state-wide elected official other
- 12 than the governor, and ((two)) at least four of whom shall be
- 13 representatives of the private sector. One member shall represent the
- 14 judicial branch and be appointed by the chief justice of the supreme
- 15 court. One member shall be the superintendent of public instruction or
- 16 shall be appointed by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 17 ((One)) Two members, one from each caucus, shall represent the house of
- 18 representatives and shall be selected by the speaker of the house of
- 19 representatives; ((one)) two members, one from each caucus, shall

- represent the senate and shall be appointed by the president of the 1
- 2 ((The representatives of the house of representatives and
- senate shall not be from the same political party.)) One member shall 3
- 4 be the director who shall be a voting member of the board.
- 5 members shall constitute the membership of the board with full voting
- Members of the board shall serve at the pleasure of the 6
- 7 appointing authority. The board shall select a chairperson from among
- 8 its members.
- 9 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner that the original 10 appointments were made.
- A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum 11
- for the transaction of business. 12
- Members of the board shall be compensated for service on the board 13
- 14 in accordance with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel
- 15 expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- Sec. 2. RCW 43.105.041 and 1996 c 171 s 8 and 1996 c 137 s 12 are 16 each reenacted and amended to read as follows: 17
- 18 (1) The board shall have the following powers and duties related to information services: 19
- (a) To develop standards governing the acquisition and disposition 20
- equipment, proprietary software and purchased services, 21
- confidentiality of computerized data; 22
- 23 (b) To purchase, lease, rent, or otherwise acquire, dispose of, and
- 24 maintain equipment, proprietary software, and purchased services, or to
- 25 delegate to other agencies and institutions of state government, under
- appropriate standards, the authority to purchase, lease, rent, or 26
- otherwise acquire, dispose of, and maintain equipment, proprietary 27
- software, and purchased services: PROVIDED, That, agencies and
- 28
- 29 institutions of state government are expressly prohibited from
- 30 acquiring or disposing of equipment, proprietary software, and
- purchased services without such delegation of authority. 31 The
- acquisition and disposition of equipment, proprietary software, and 32
- 33 purchased services is exempt from RCW 43.19.1919 and, as provided in
- RCW 43.19.1901, from the provisions of RCW 43.19.190 through 43.19.200. 34
- This subsection (1)(b) does not apply to the legislative branch; 35
- 36 (c) To develop state-wide or interagency technical policies,
- 37 standards, and procedures;

- (d) To review and approve standards and common specifications for 1 new or expanded telecommunications networks proposed by agencies, 2 public postsecondary education institutions, educational service 3 4 districts, or state-wide or regional providers of K-12 information technology services, and to assure the cost-effective development and 5 incremental implementation of a state-wide video telecommunications 6 7 system to serve: Public schools; educational service districts; 8 vocational-technical institutes; community colleges; colleges and 9 universities; state and local government; and the general public 10 through public affairs programming;
- (e) To provide direction concerning strategic planning goals and objectives for the state. The board shall seek input from the legislature and the judiciary;
- 14 (f) To develop and implement a process for the resolution of 15 appeals by:
- 16 (i) Vendors concerning the conduct of an acquisition process by an 17 agency or the department; or
- 18 (ii) A customer agency concerning the provision of services by the 19 department or by other state agency providers;
- 20 (g) To establish policies for the periodic review by the department 21 of agency performance which may include but are not limited to analysis 22 of:
 - (i) Planning, management, control, and use of information services;
- 24 (ii) Training and education; and
- 25 (iii) Project management;

- (h) To set its meeting schedules and convene at scheduled times, or meet at the request of a majority of its members, the chair, or the director; and
- 29 (i) To review and approve that portion of the department's budget 30 requests that provides for support to the board.
- 31 (2) State-wide technical standards to promote and facilitate 32 electronic information sharing and access are an essential component of 33 acceptable and reliable public access service and complement content-34 related standards designed to meet those goals. The board shall:
- 35 (a) Establish technical standards to facilitate electronic access 36 to government information and interoperability of information systems.
- 37 Local governments are strongly encouraged to follow the standards

- 1 (b) Require agencies to consider electronic public access needs 2 when planning new information systems or major upgrades of systems.
- In developing these standards, the board is encouraged to include the state library, state archives, and appropriate representatives of state and local government.
- (3) At least twice a year the chair shall report to the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate on the status of information technology projects and initiatives in state government.

 At the discretion of the individual chairs, such reports may be oral

- 11 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.105.190 and 1996 c 137 s 15 are each amended to 12 read as follows:
- (1) The department, with the approval of the board, shall establish standards and policies governing the planning, implementation, and evaluation of major information technology projects, including those proposed by the superintendent of public instruction, in conjunction with educational service districts, or state-wide or regional providers of K-12 education information technology services. The standards and policies shall:
- 20 (a) Establish criteria to identify projects which are subject to 21 this section. Such criteria shall include, but not be limited to, 22 significant anticipated cost, complexity, or state-wide significance of 23 the project; and
- 24 (b) Establish a model process and procedures which agencies shall 25 follow in developing and implementing project plans. Agencies may propose, for approval by the department, a process and procedures 26 The department may accept or require 27 unique to the agency. modification of such agency proposals or the department may reject such 28 29 agency proposals and require use of the model process and procedures 30 established under this subsection. Any process and procedures developed under this subsection shall require (i) distinct and 31 32 identifiable phases upon which funding may be based, (ii) user validation of products through system demonstrations and testing of 33 34 prototypes and deliverables, and (iii) other elements identified by the 35 board.
- Project plans and any agreements established under such plans shall be approved and mutually agreed upon by the director, the director of financial management, and the head of the agency proposing the project.

- The director may terminate a major project if the director determines that the project is not meeting or is not expected to meet anticipated performance standards.
- 4 (2) The office of financial management shall establish policies and 5 standards governing the funding of projects developed under this 6 section. The policies and standards shall provide for:
- 7 (a) Funding of a project under terms and conditions mutually agreed 8 to by the director, the director of financial management, and the head 9 of the agency proposing the project. However, the office of financial 10 management may require incremental funding of a project on a phase-by-11 phase basis whereby funds for a given phase of a project may be released only when the office of financial management determines, with 12 13 the advice of the department, that the previous phase is satisfactorily completed; 14
- (b) Acceptance testing of products to assure that products perform satisfactorily before they are accepted and final payment is made; and (c) Other elements deemed necessary by the office of financial
- management.

 (3) The department shall evaluate projects at three stages of development as follows: (a) Initial needs assessment; (b) feasibility study including definition of scope, development of tasks and timelines, and estimated costs and benefits; and (c) final project
- Copies of project evaluations conducted under this subsection shall be submitted to the office of financial management ((and)), the chairs,

implementation plan based upon available funding.
